



## **Dual Enrollment Program**

### **Student Eligibility Framework**

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Nunez Community College, in partnership with local high schools, offers qualified students an opportunity to enroll in college courses while attending high school. Courses are taught on the participating high school campus, by high school teachers that are credentialed college adjunct instructors, online through a hybrid model, or on the Nunez Campus by Nunez faculty. Students earn both high school and college credit for the courses in this program with grades appearing on both high school and college permanent transcripts.

#### **Criteria to Enroll in Nunez Dual Enrollment Courses**

Nunez complies with the **Louisiana Board of Regents Academic Affairs Policy 2.22**. While this policy provides the minimum criteria to participate in the program, Nunez and/or participating high schools may, at their discretion, determine additional criteria for students to participate in the program.

#### **Minimum criteria for dual enrollment**

1. Be on track to complete the Louisiana prescribed diploma curriculum
2. Be in the 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade
3. Meet any prerequisite qualifications as published in the college catalog

#### **For Academic Courses found on the Master Articulation Matrix\***

In addition to the minimum criteria above, students must meet the following criteria in order to enroll:

1. Students must maintain a cumulative **high school GPA of at least 2.5** to enroll in an academic course.
2. Students must demonstrate college readiness as indicated by an **ACT (or equivalent) Composite of at least 19** with sub-scores of at least **19 (Math)** and **18 (English)**.
3. *Students who have less than an 18 in English, but meet the Composite and Math scores, may be allowed to enroll in mathematics and chemistry courses.*
4. *Students who have less than a 19 in Math, but meet the Composite and English scores, may be allowed to enroll in English, foreign language, history, biology, or introductory social science, humanities, or arts survey courses.*
5. Seniors in their spring semester must meet all three readiness indicators in order to enroll.

*\*Please refer to the full LA Board of Regents AA Policy 2.22 for more details and stipulations regarding student eligibility.*

#### **For Career and Technical Courses\*\***

In addition to the minimum criteria above, students must demonstrate:

1. A score of 15 or above on the Mathematics AND English portions of the pre-ACT Assessment on the ACT, or the equivalent value on the SAT, or silver level score on the assessments of the ACT WorkKeys system, **OR**
2. Eligibility for the highest level developmental reading course (ACT composite score of 13 or greater, or equivalent test score) **AND** a score of at least 700 on applicable End of Course examinations (or the equivalent LEAP 2020 score).

*\*\*Additional criteria for some technical coursework may be enforced by the Nunez Academic Affairs Office (e.g. Certified Nursing Assistant requires a 15 composite score or equivalent).*
