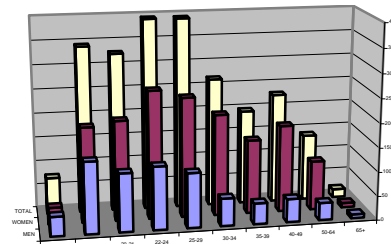
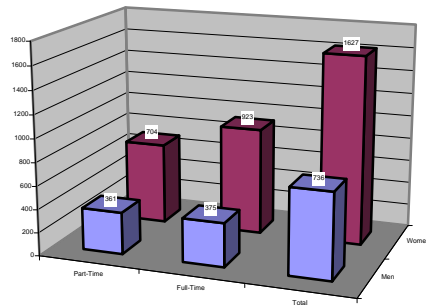
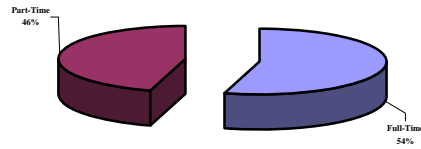

## GOALS

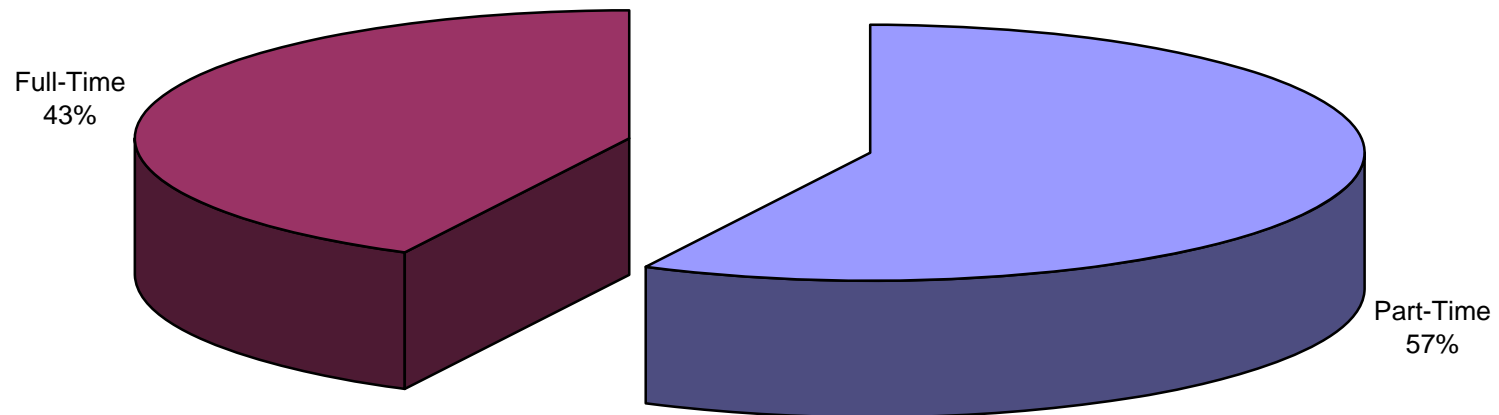
*Specific educational goals of the college are to offer:*

- \* Continuing education courses and services that meet the needs of students and the community.



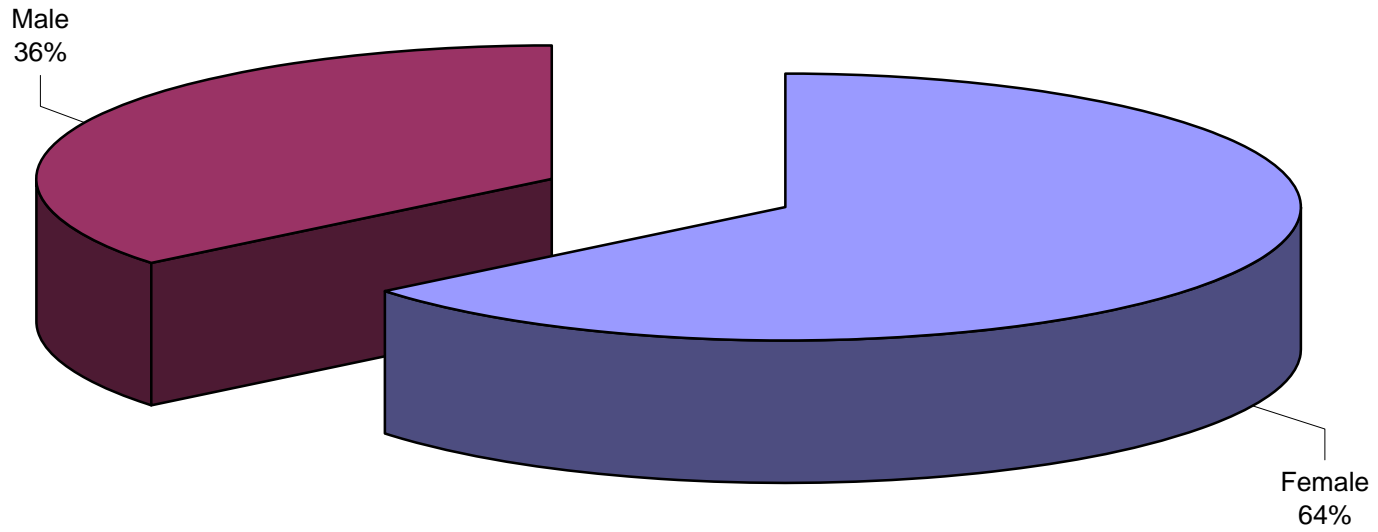

# Students Enrollment Status Fall 2007

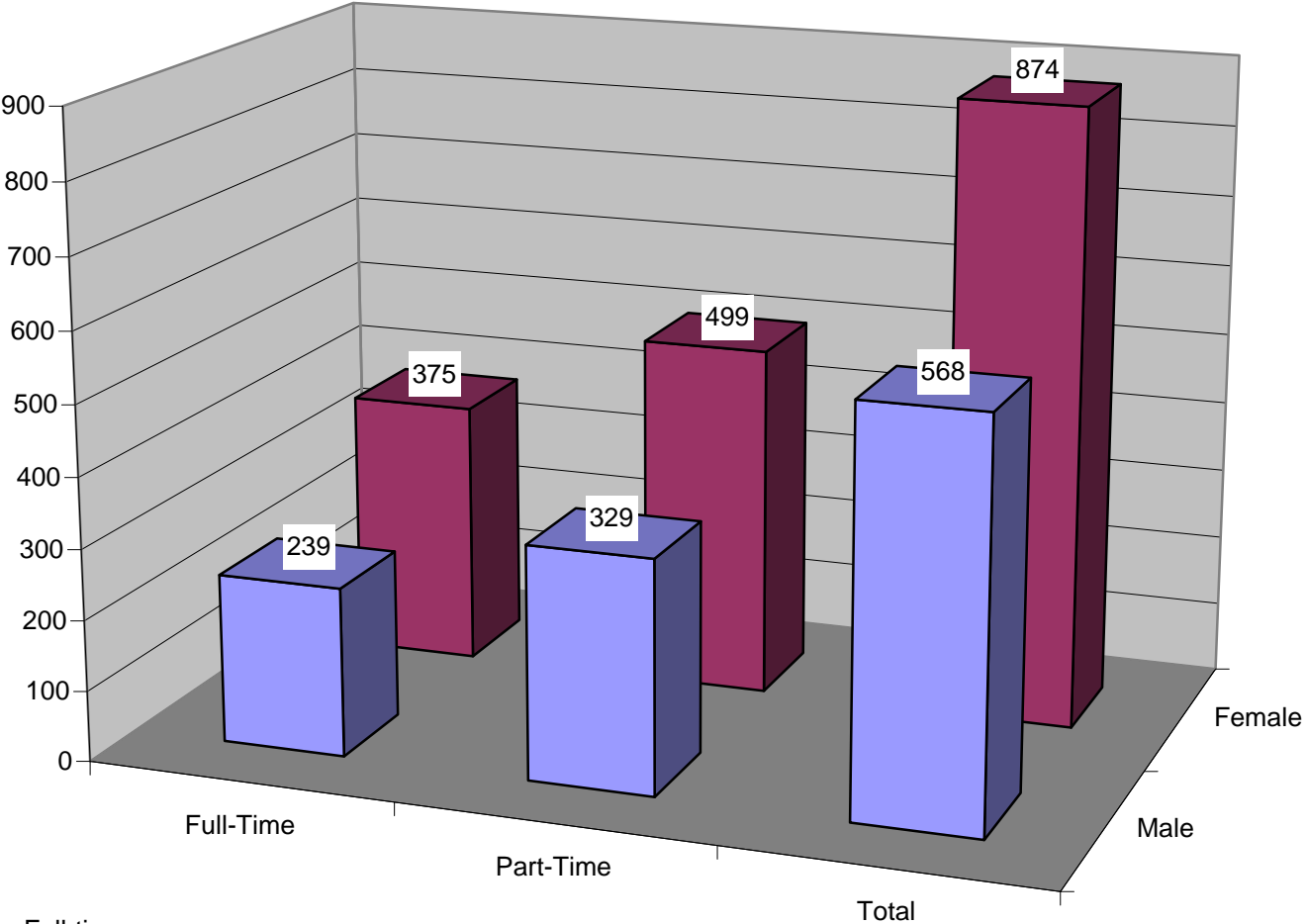

# Students by Gender Fall 2007



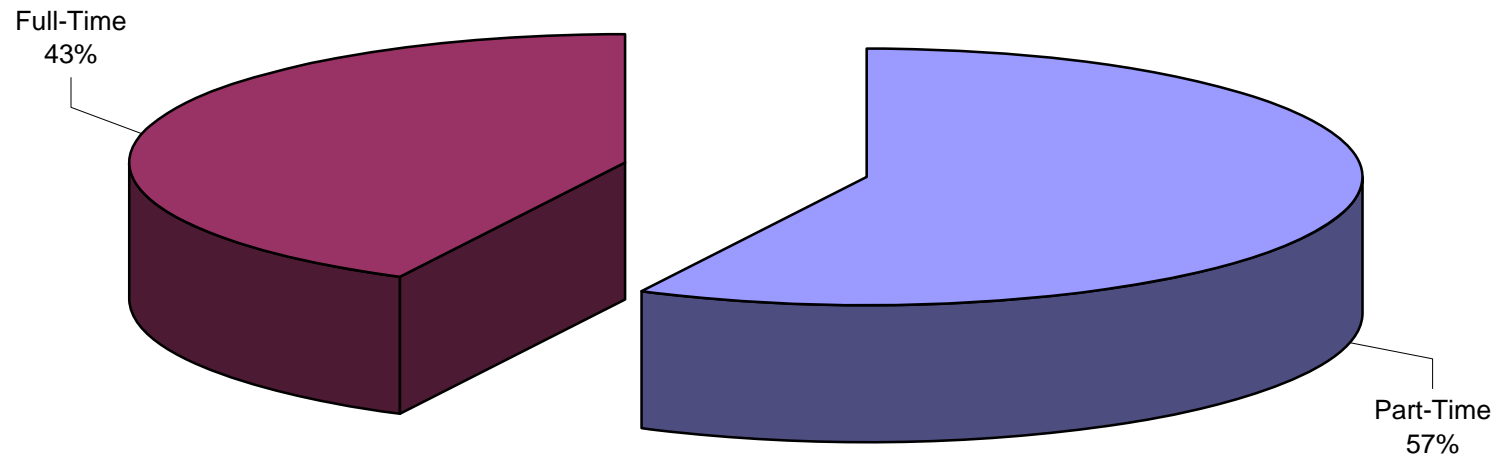
# Enrollment Status by Gender Fall 2007

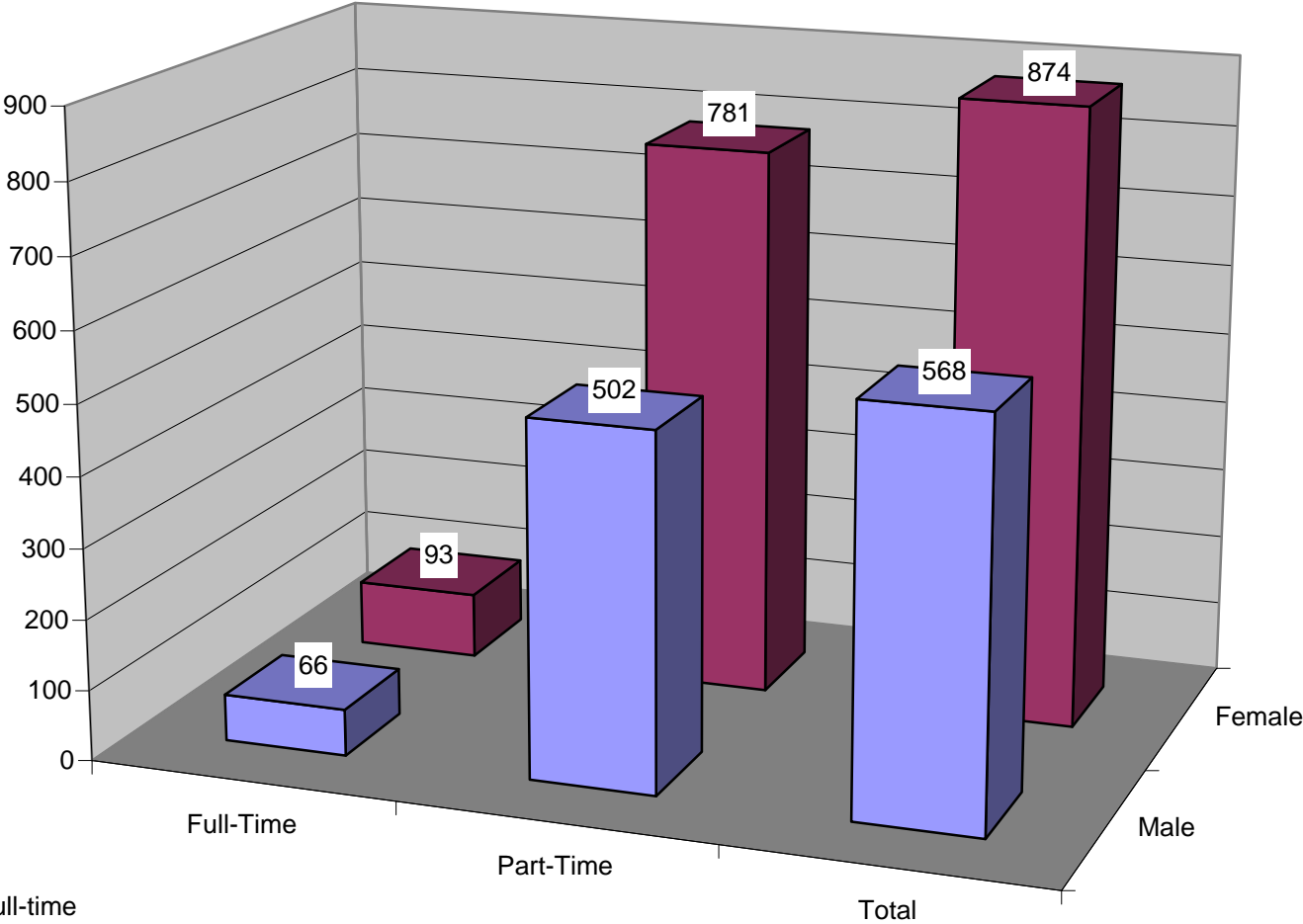


# Students Enrollment Status Fall 2007



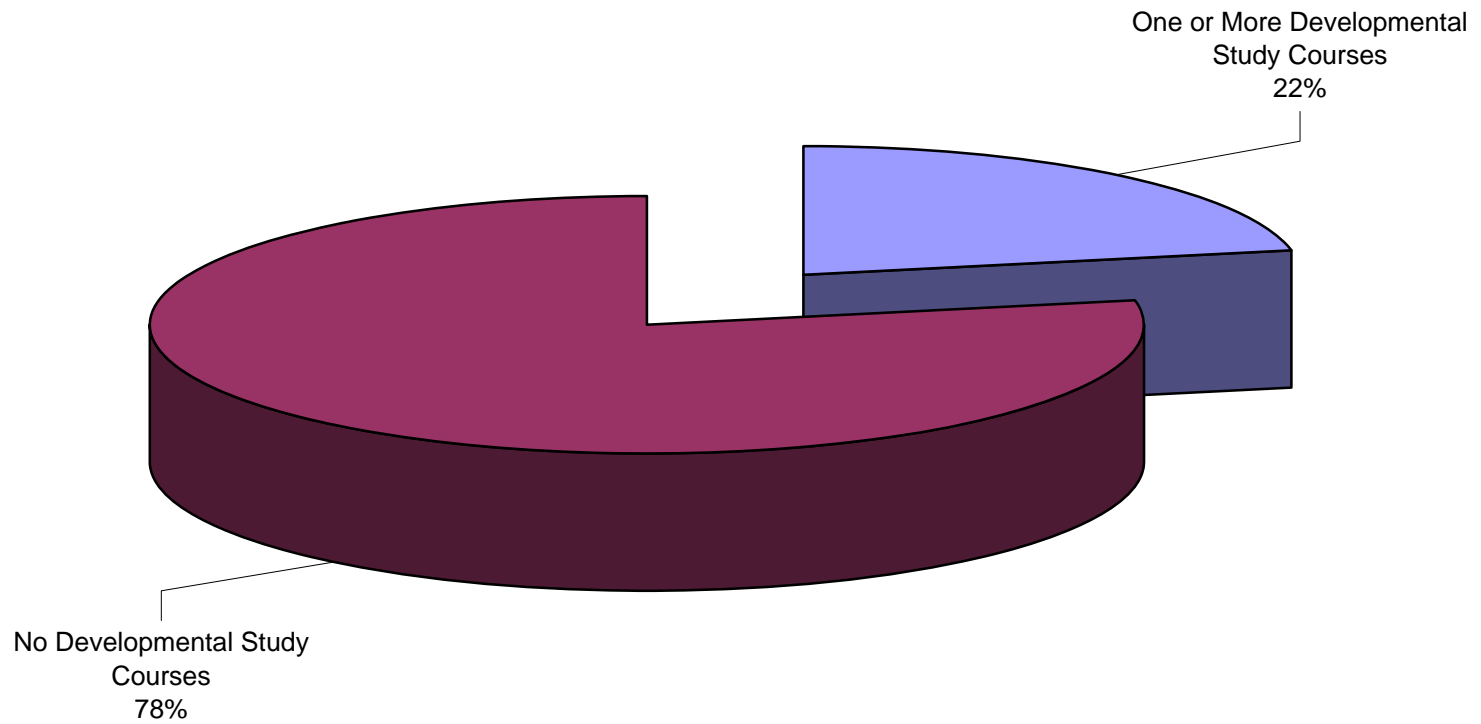

# Enrollment Status by Gender Fall 2007



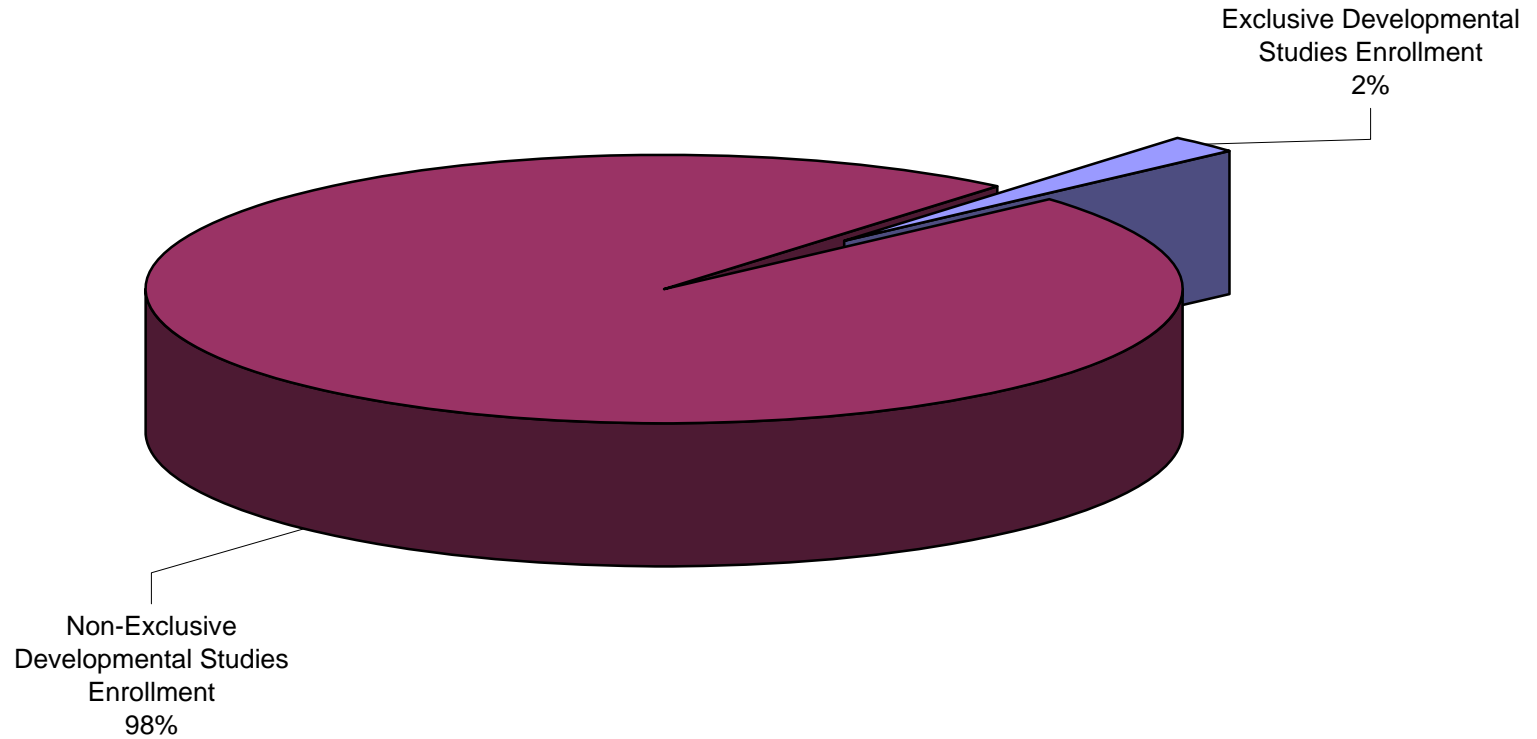

# Developmental Studies Enrollment Aggregate Fall 2007

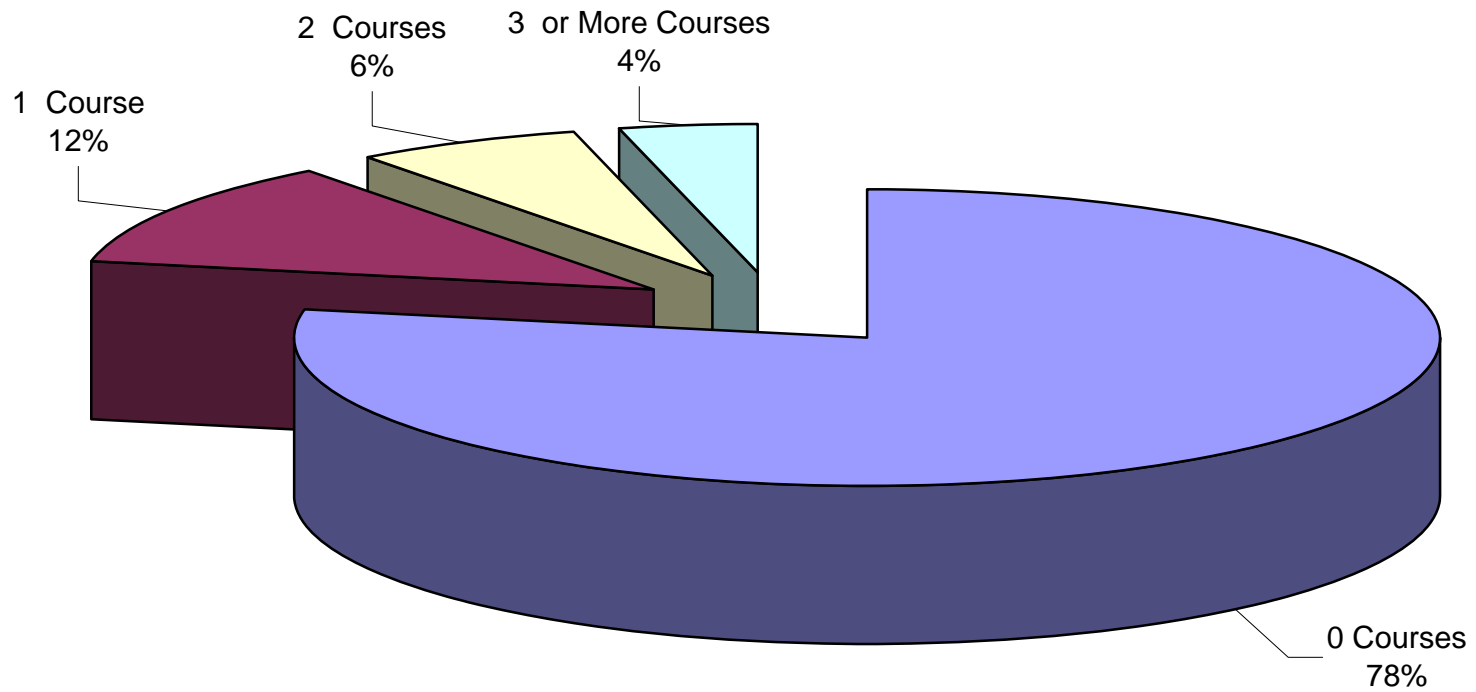

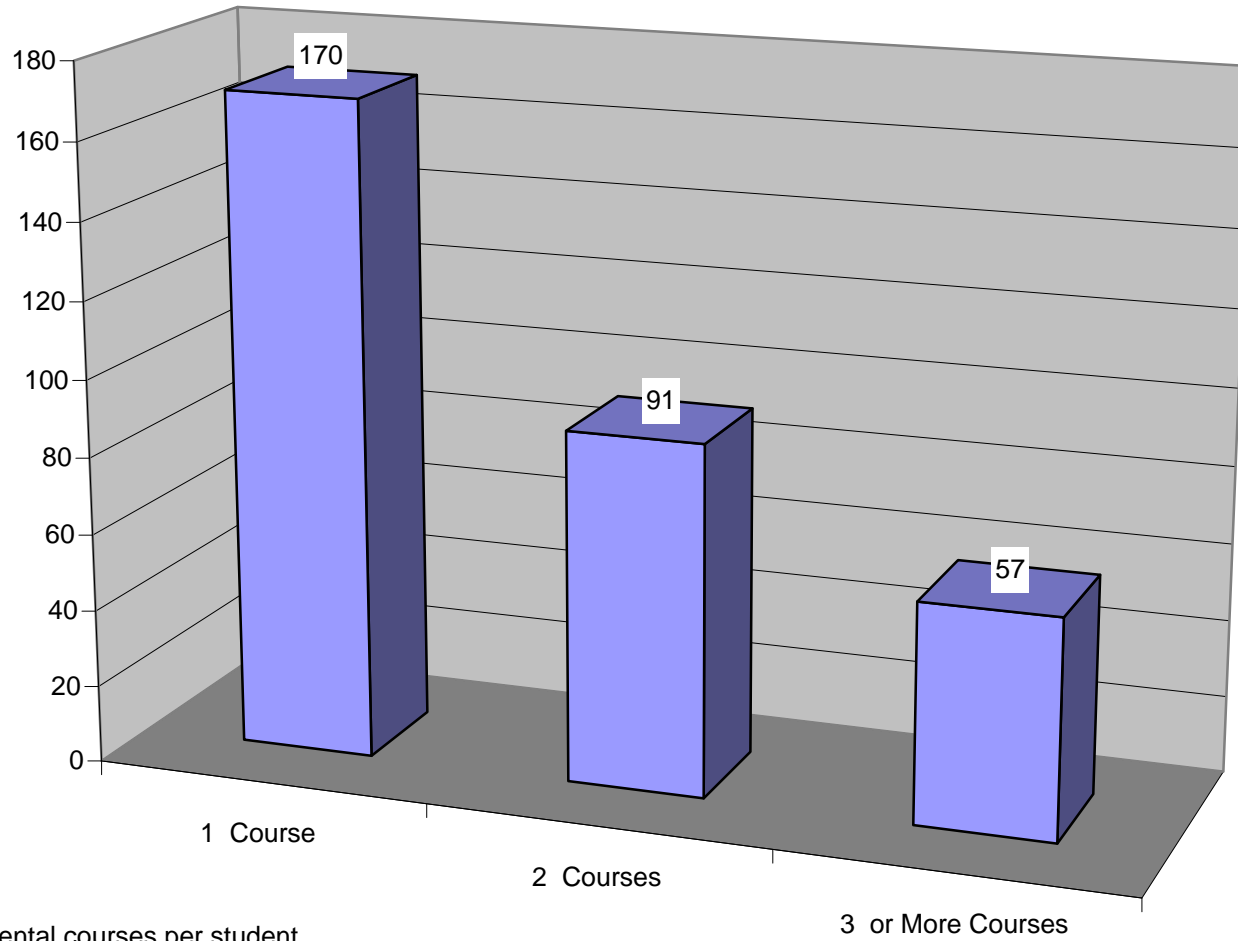
# Students Enrolled Exclusively in Developmental Studies Courses Fall 2007

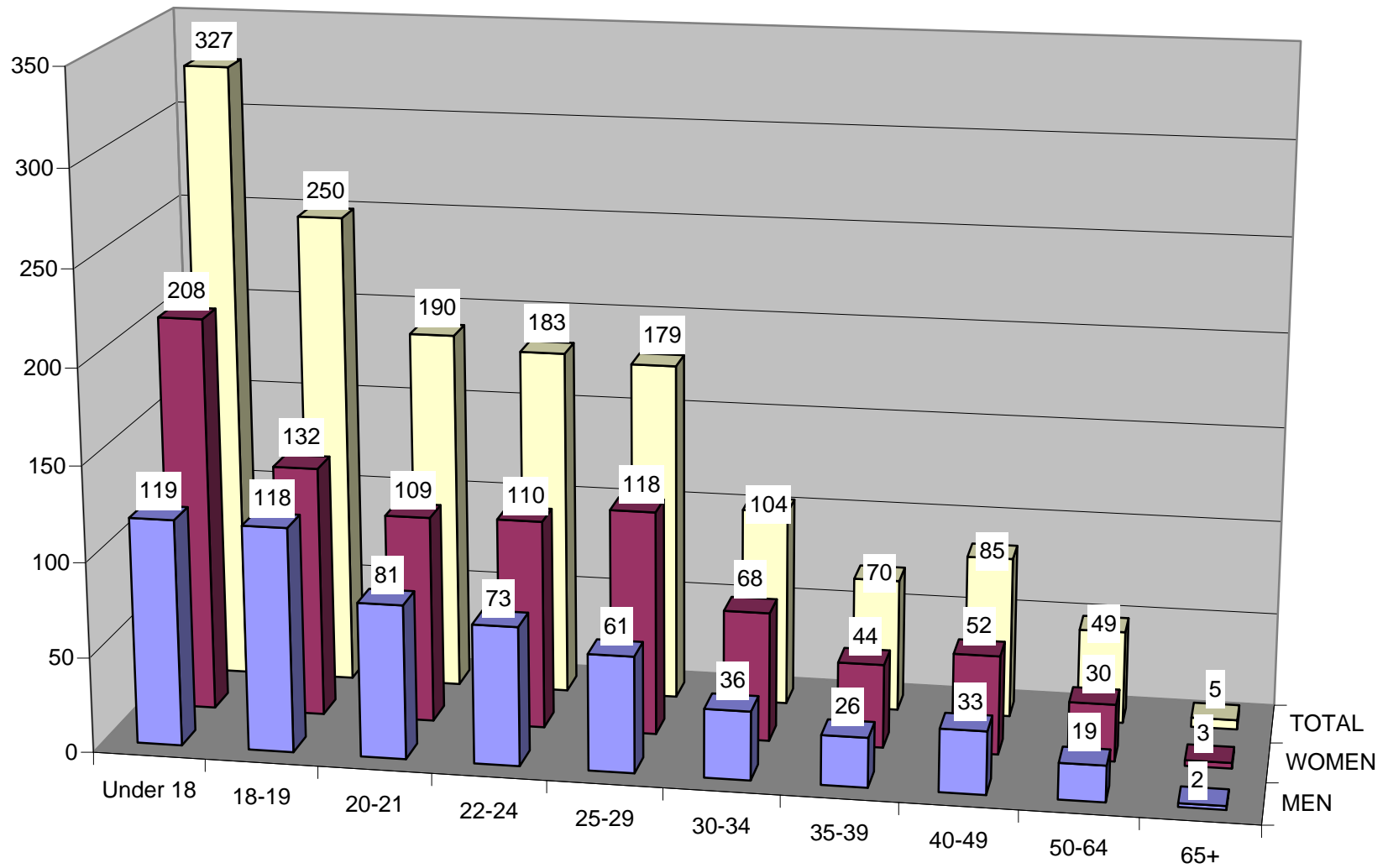

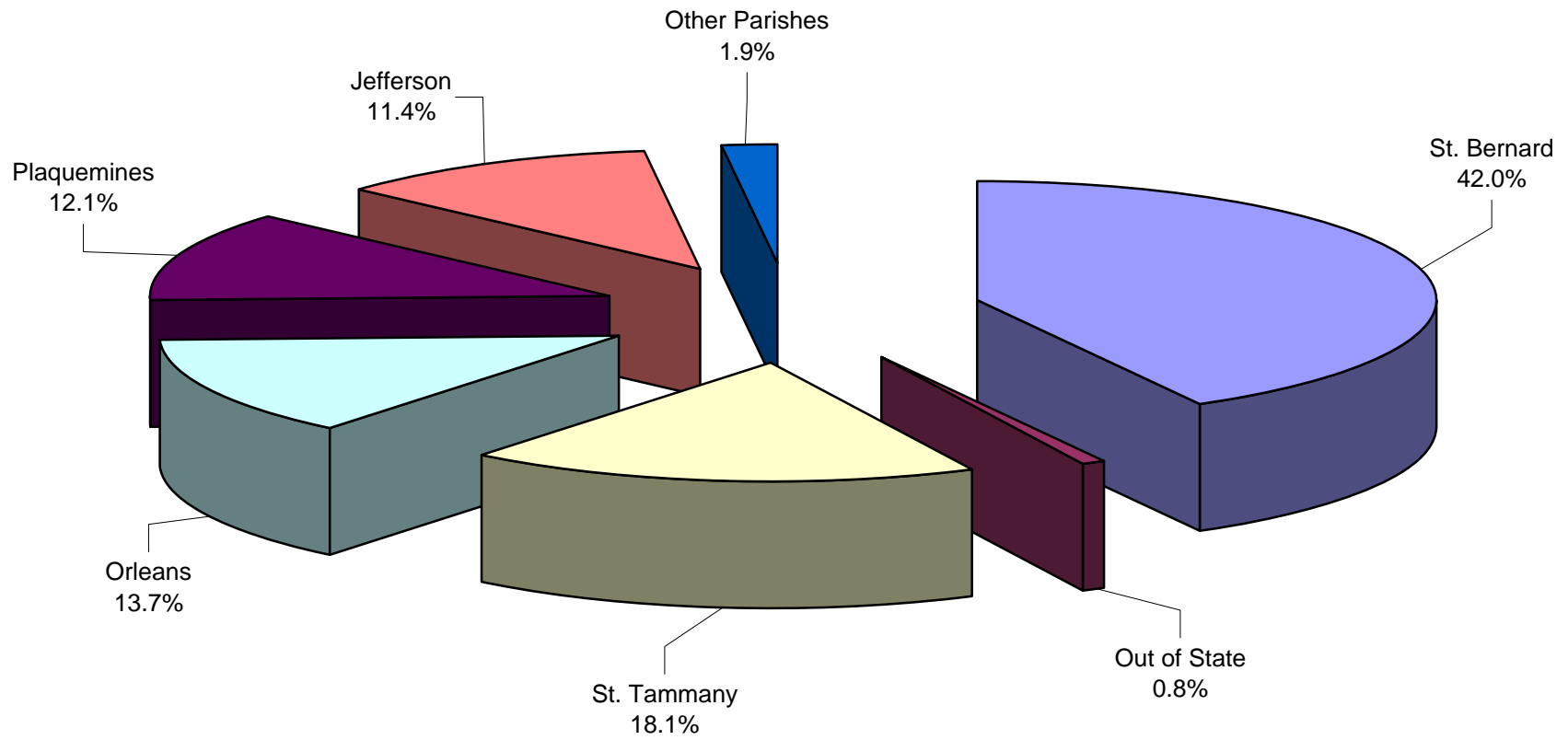


How many developmental courses per student enrolled in developmental courses.

# Students by Age Distribution Fall 2007

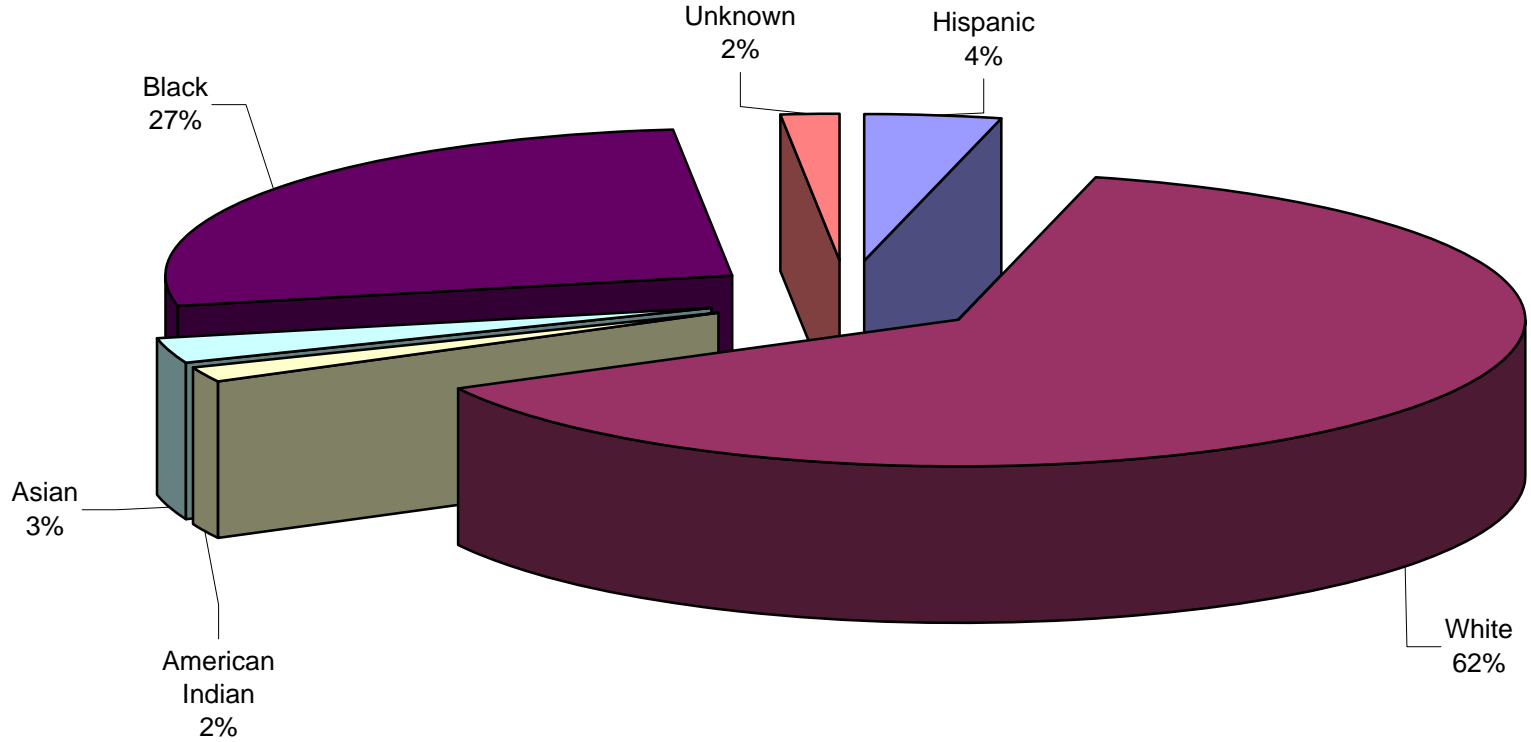


# Students by Residency Fall 2007

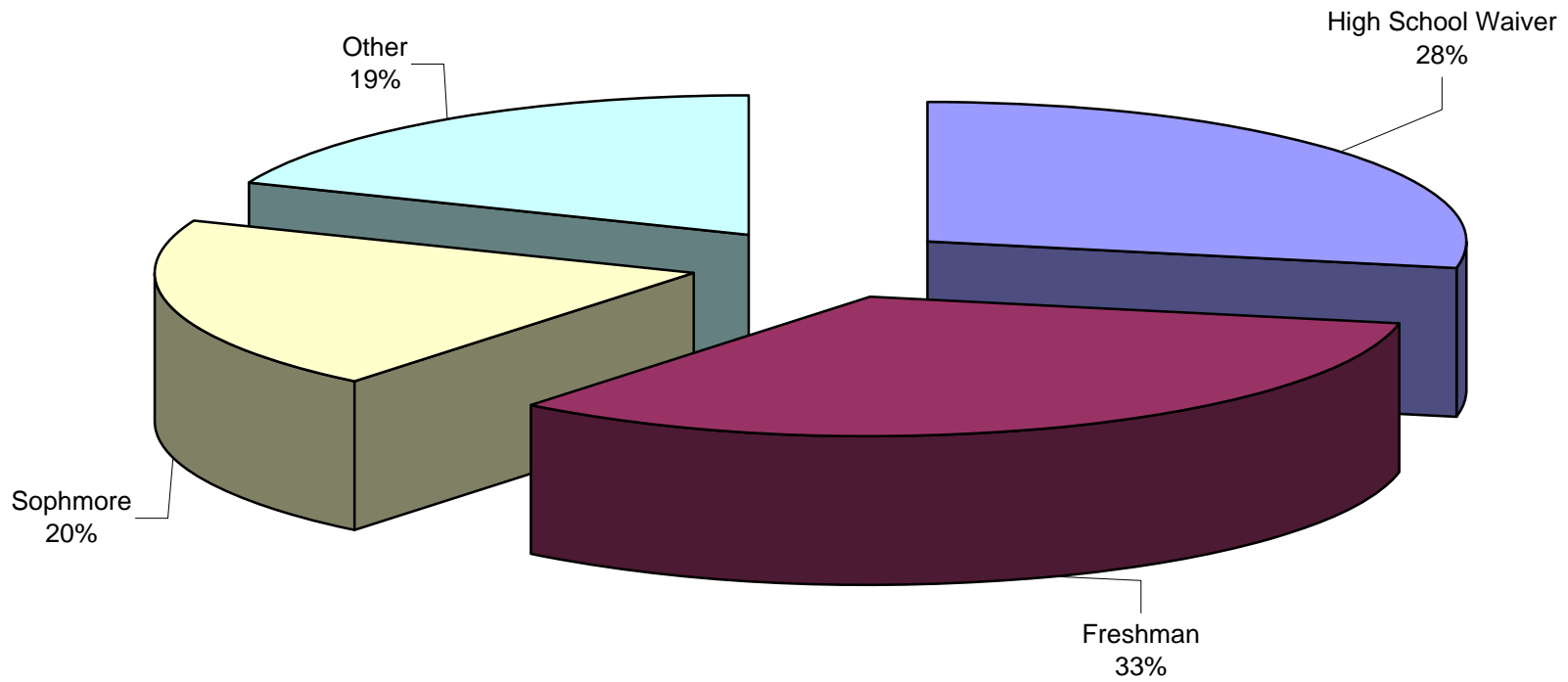




# Student Enrollment by Ethnicity Fall 2007

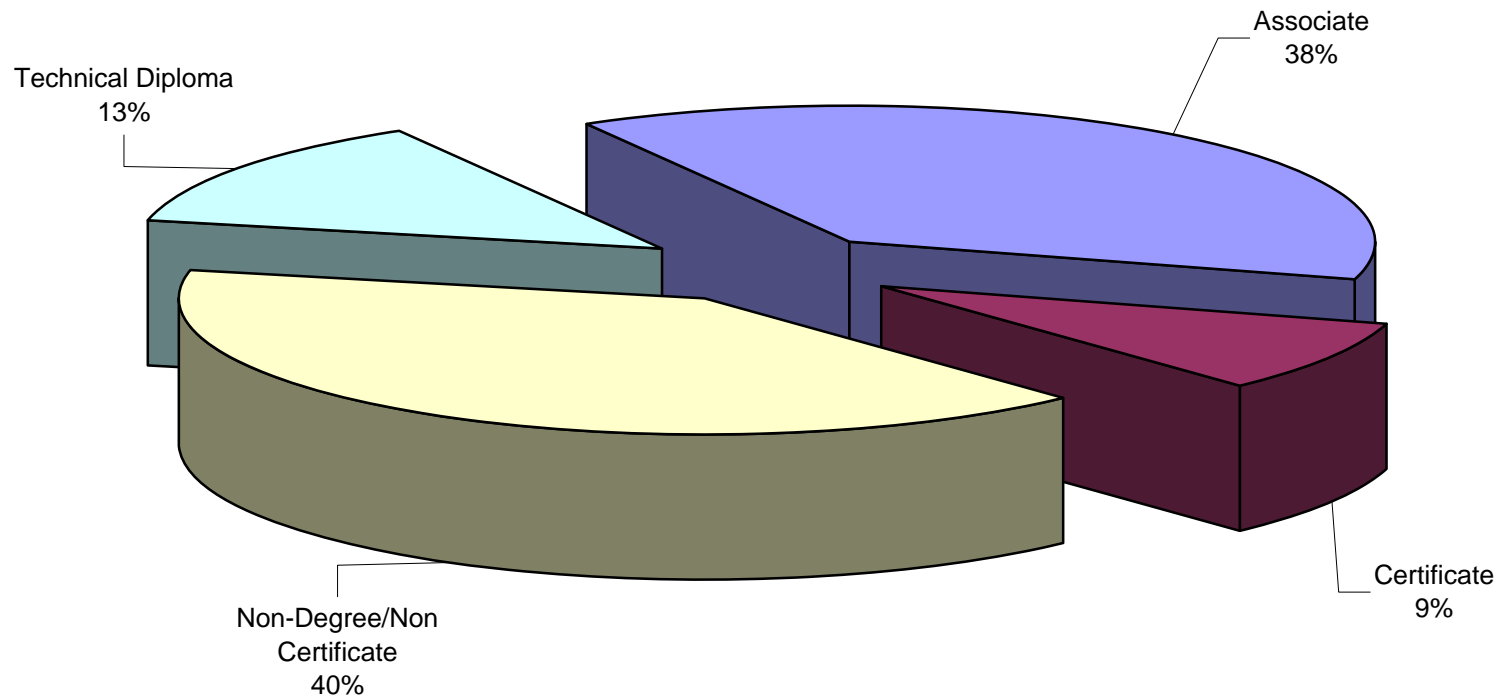


# Students by Year of Study Fall 2007



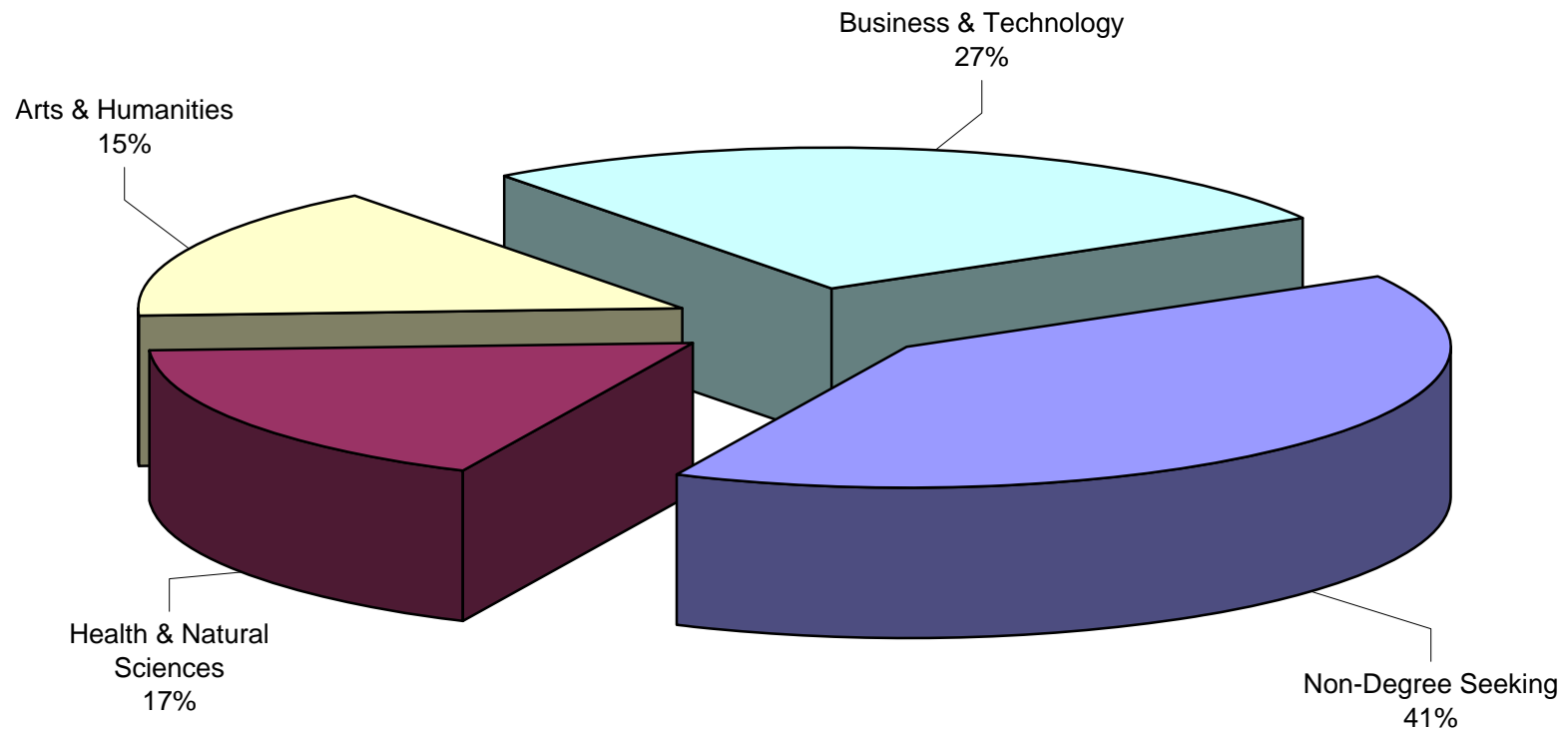

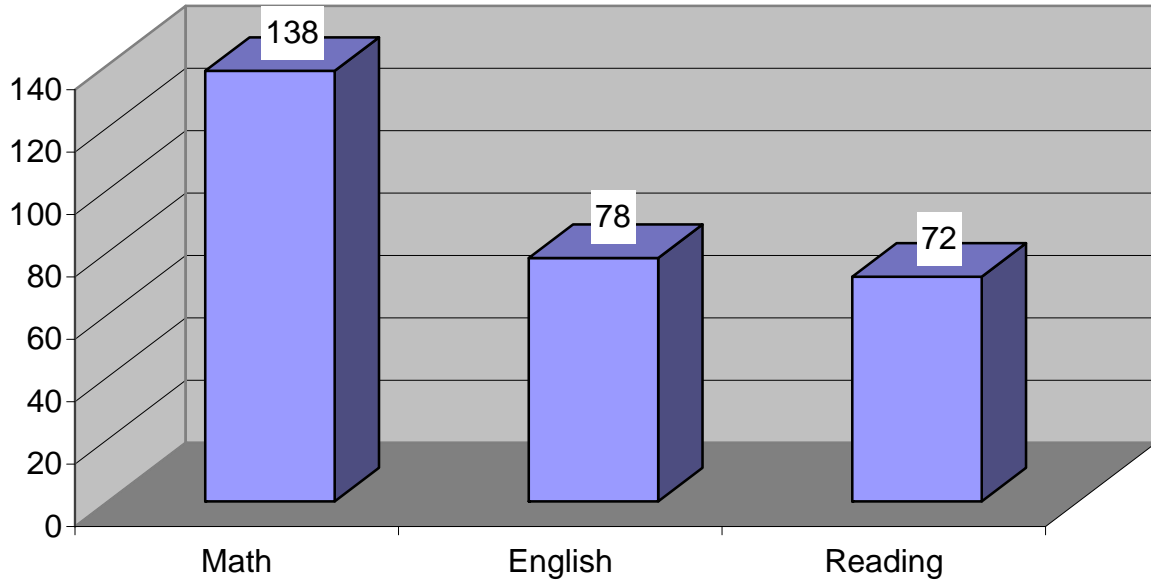

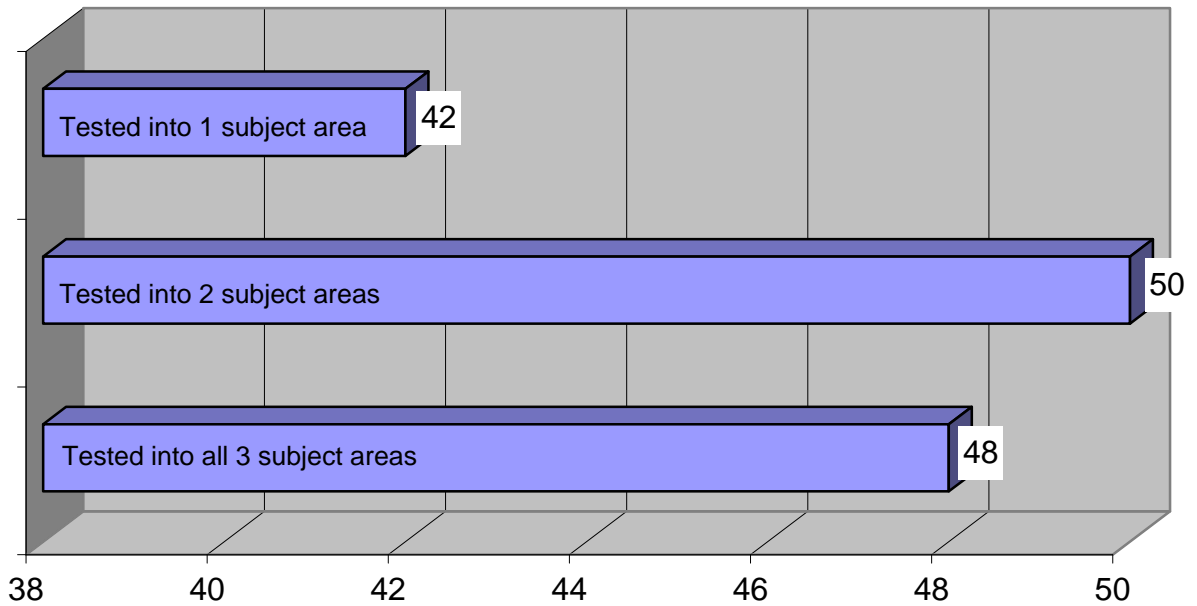
# First-time Freshman Placement Test Results Fall 2007



### Developmental Placement Test Results by Subject



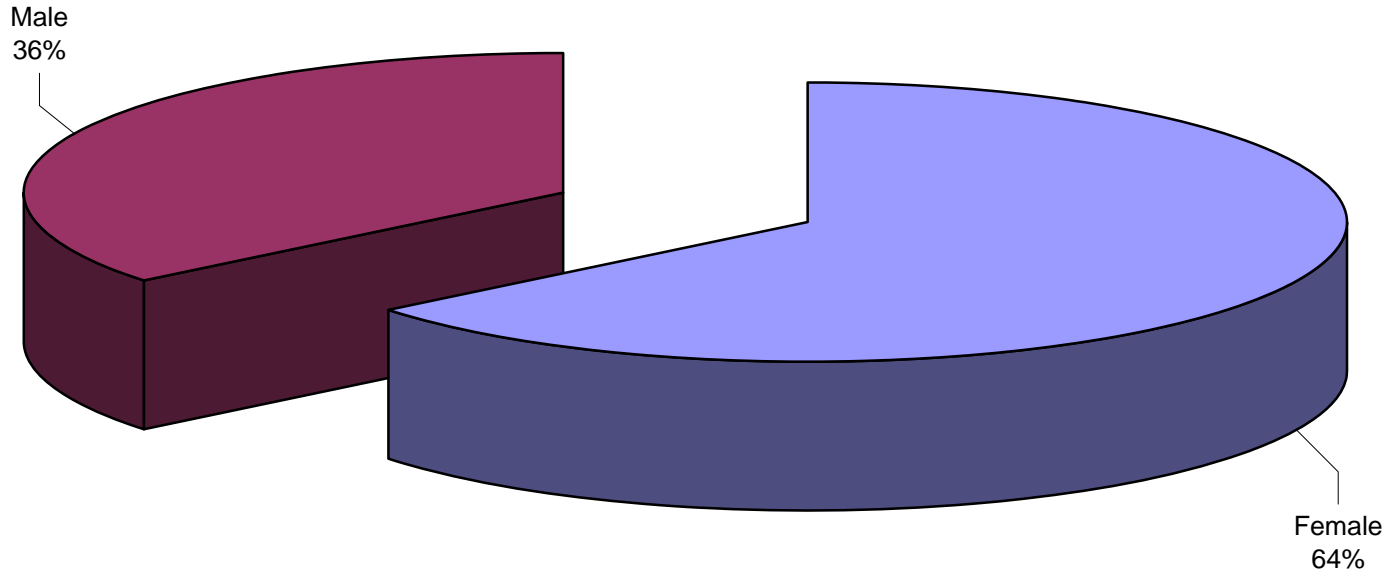

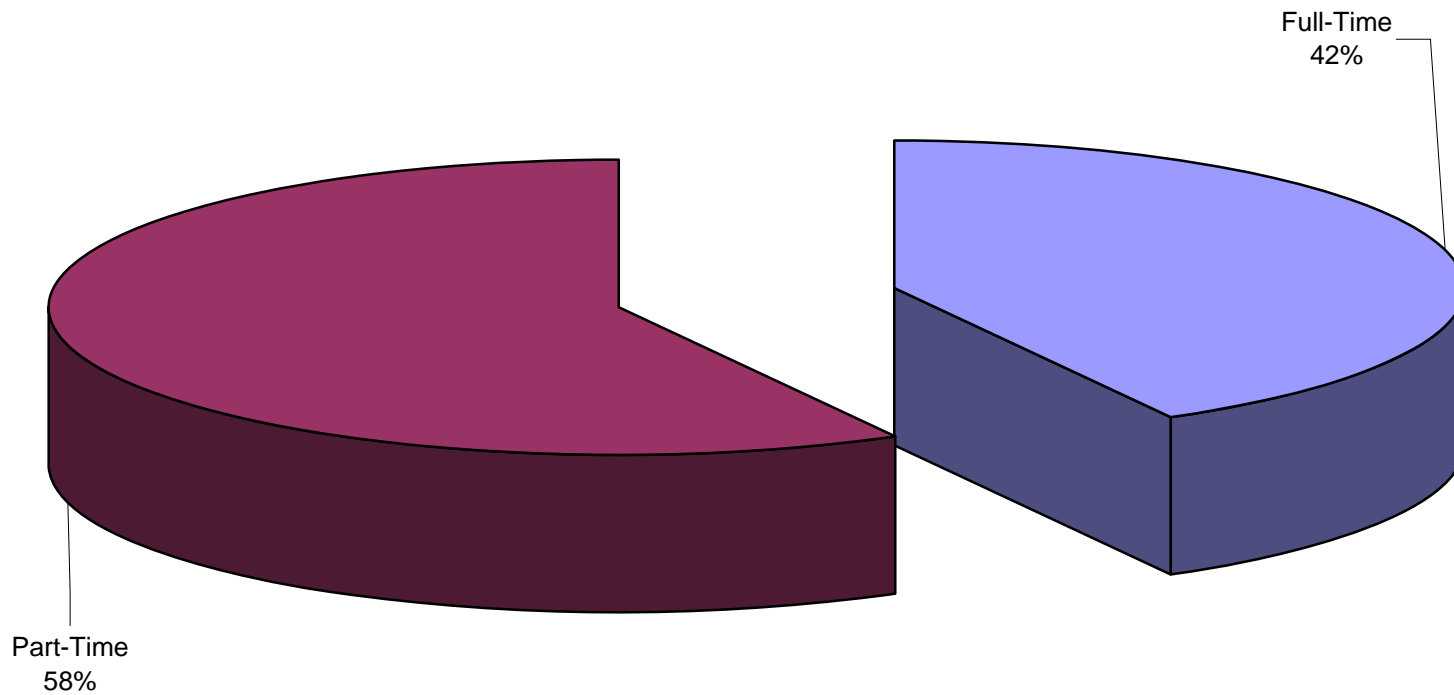

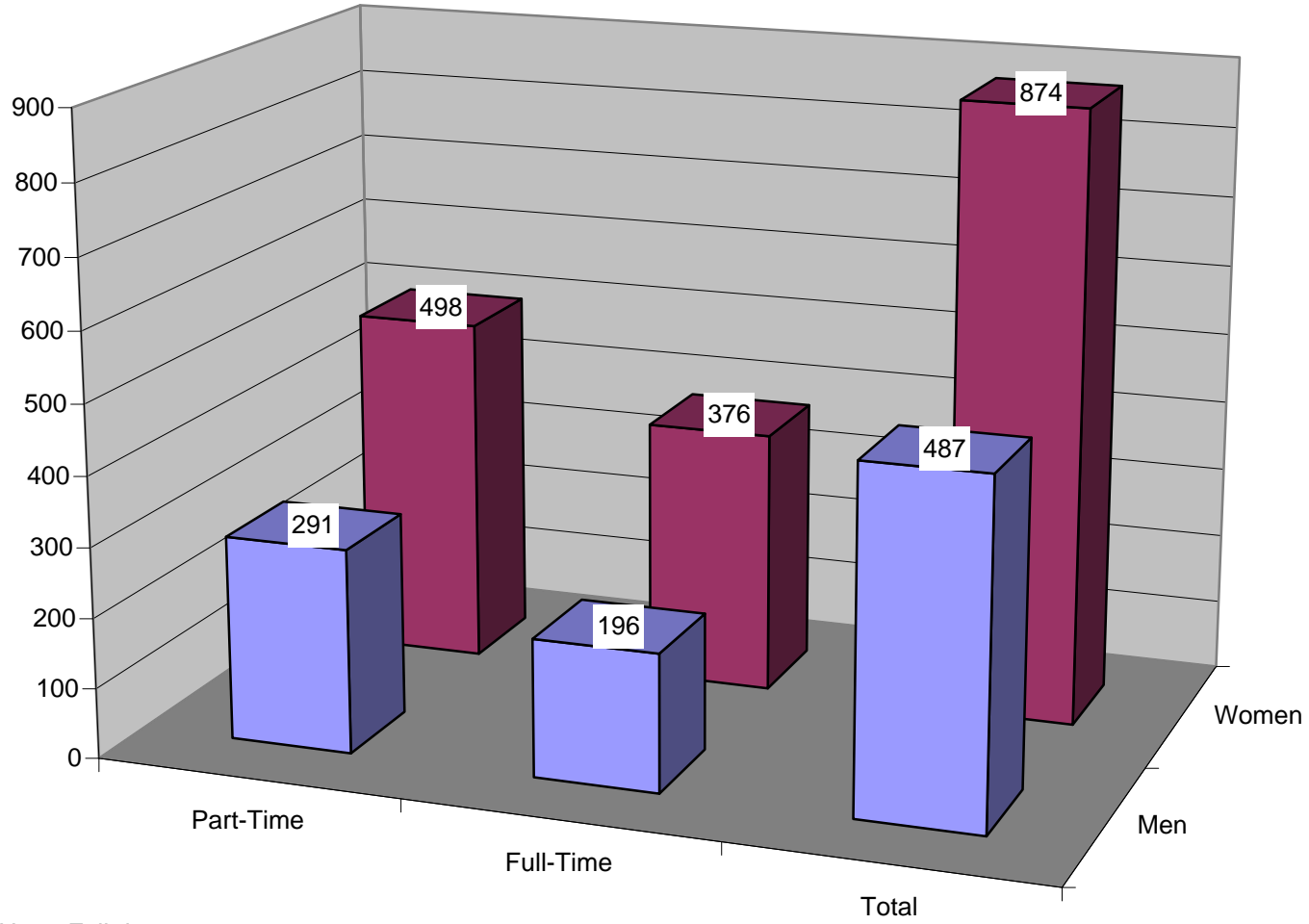


# Students Enrollment Status Spring 2008



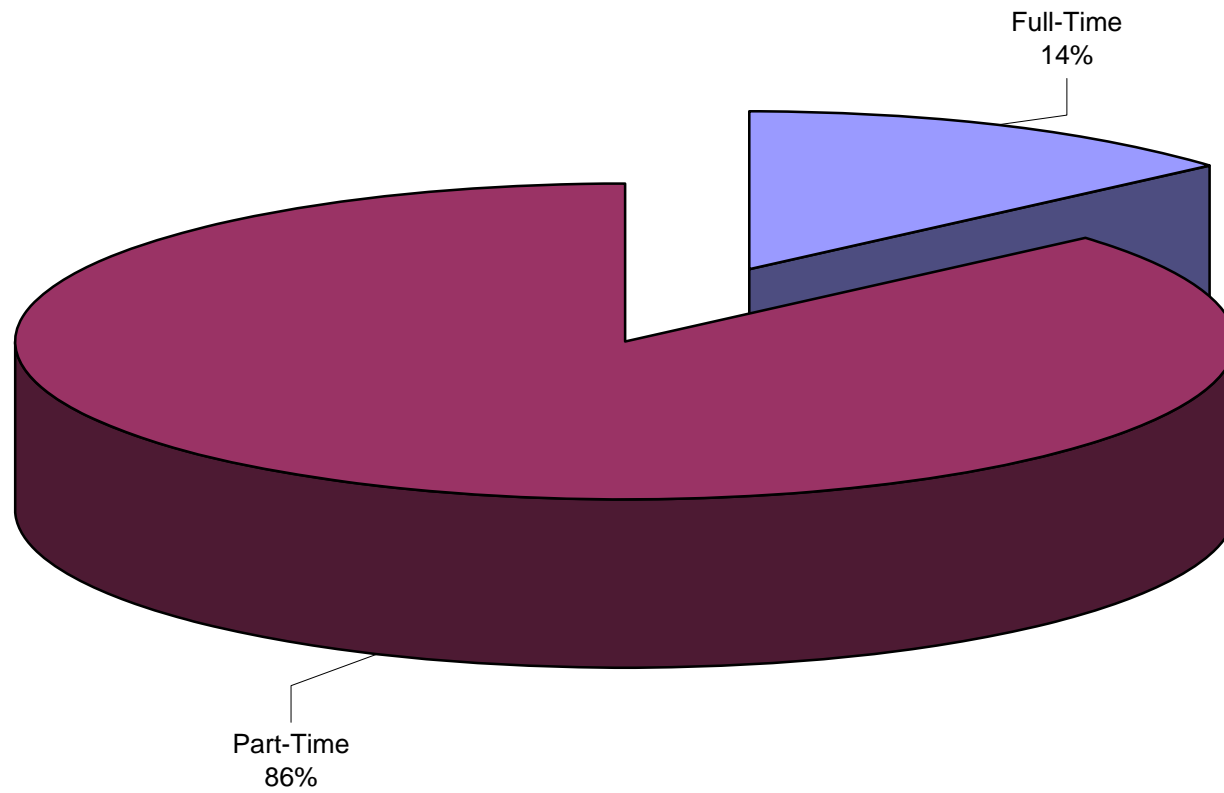

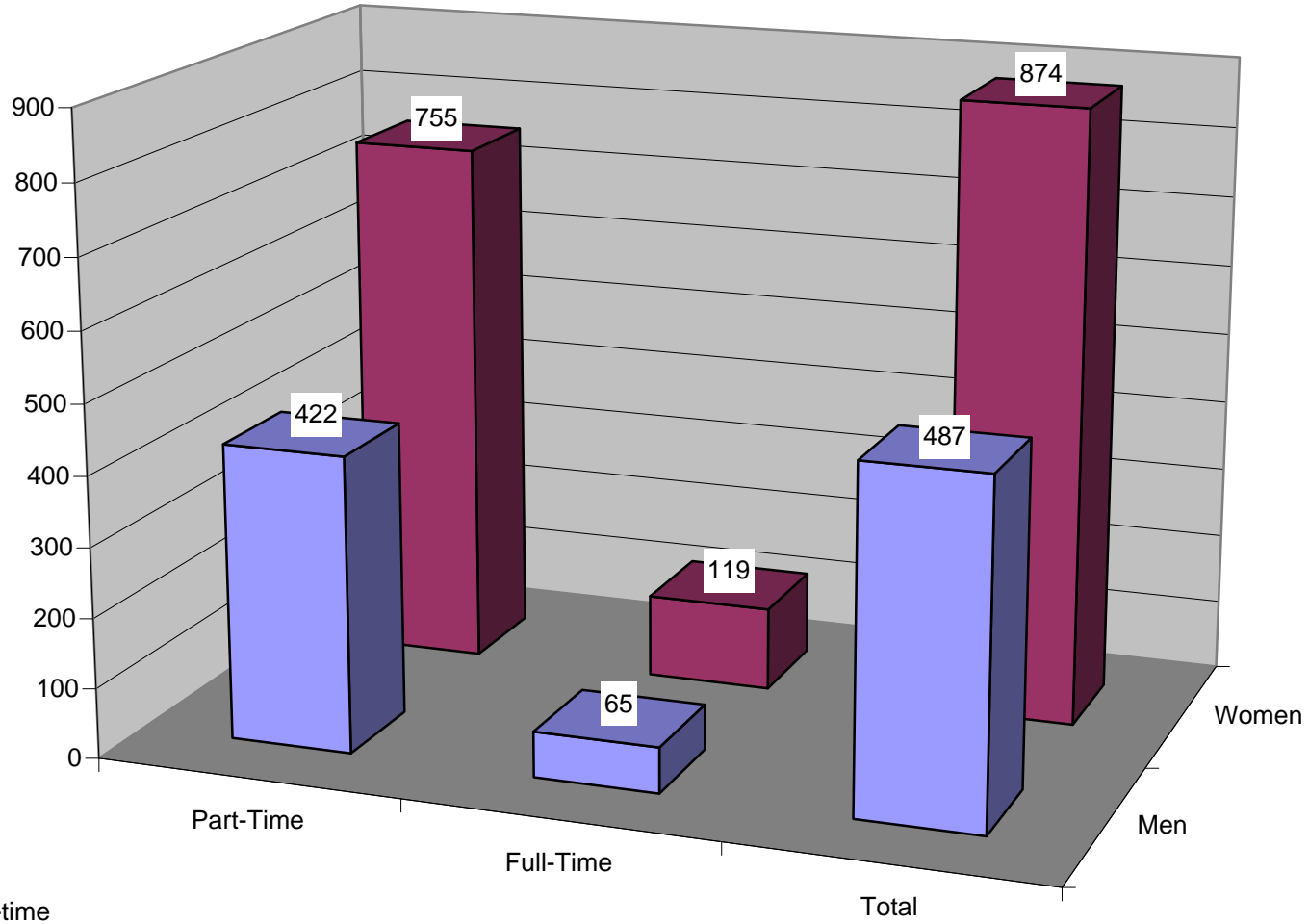
# Students Enrollment Status Spring 2008

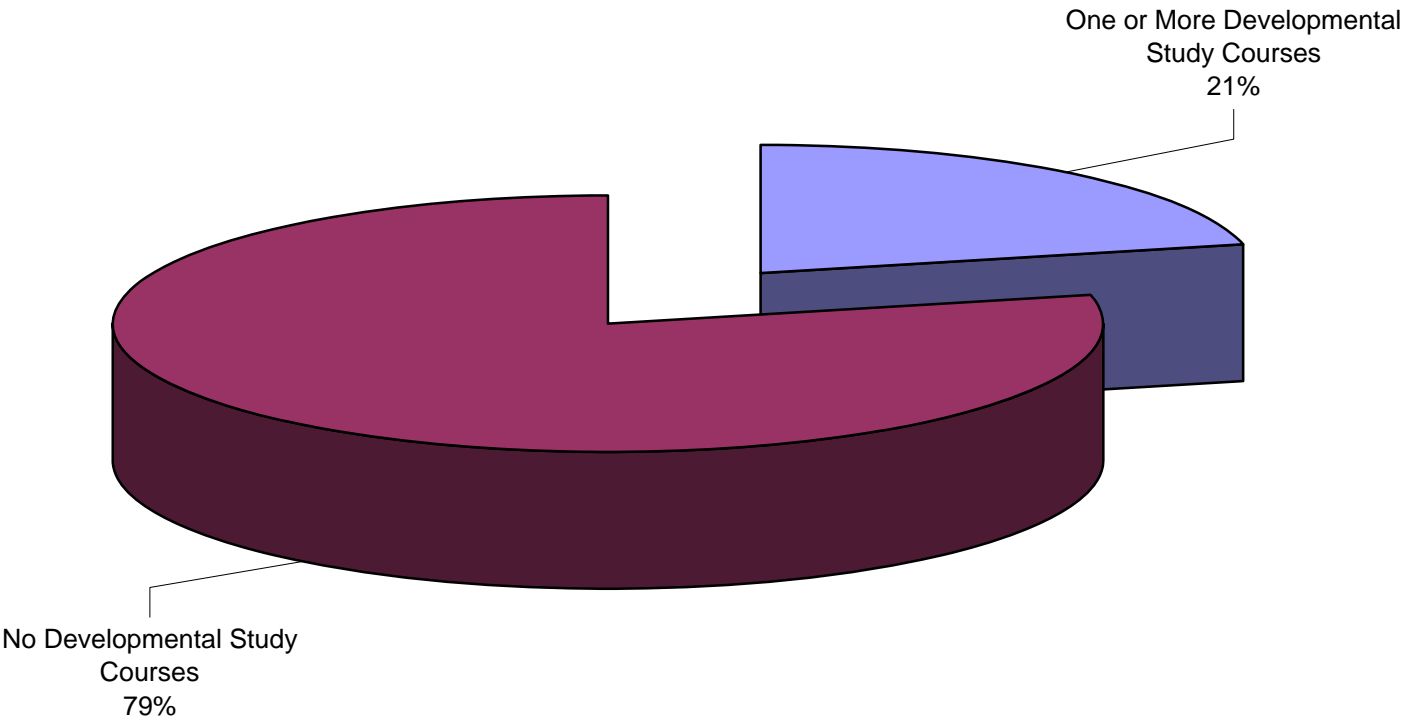


# Enrollment Status by Gender Spring 2008

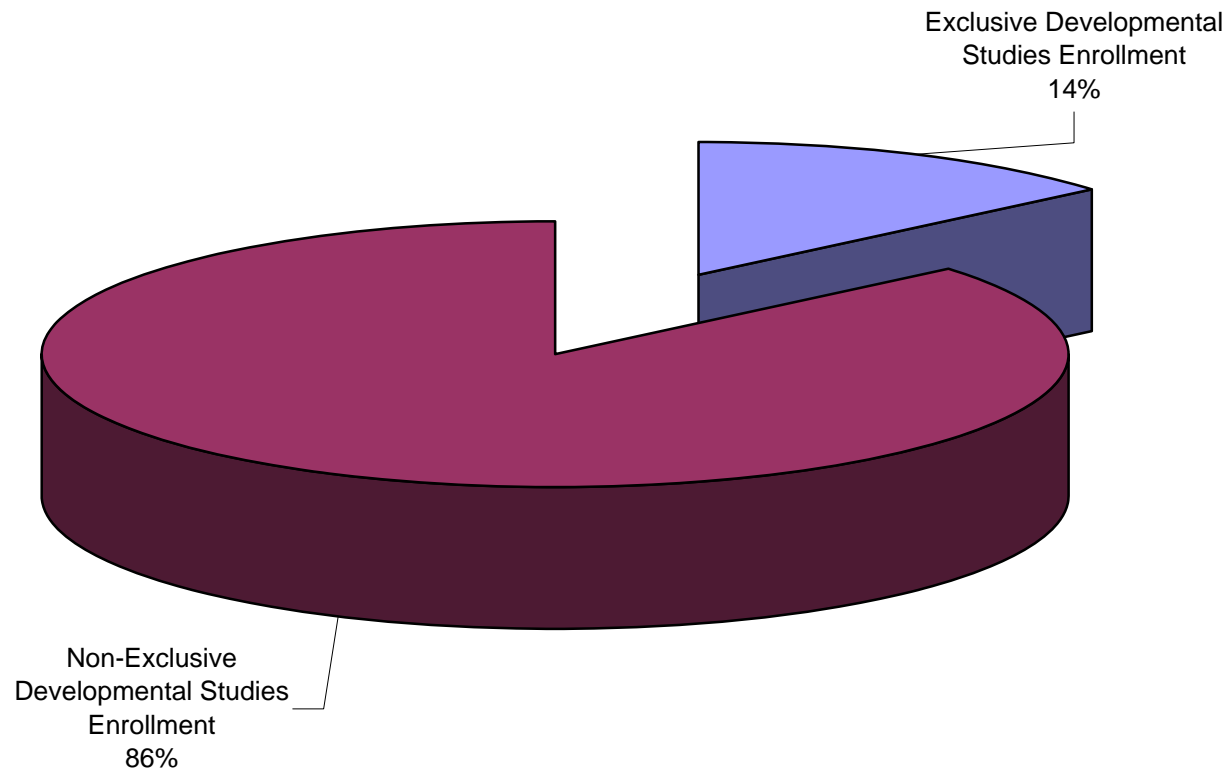

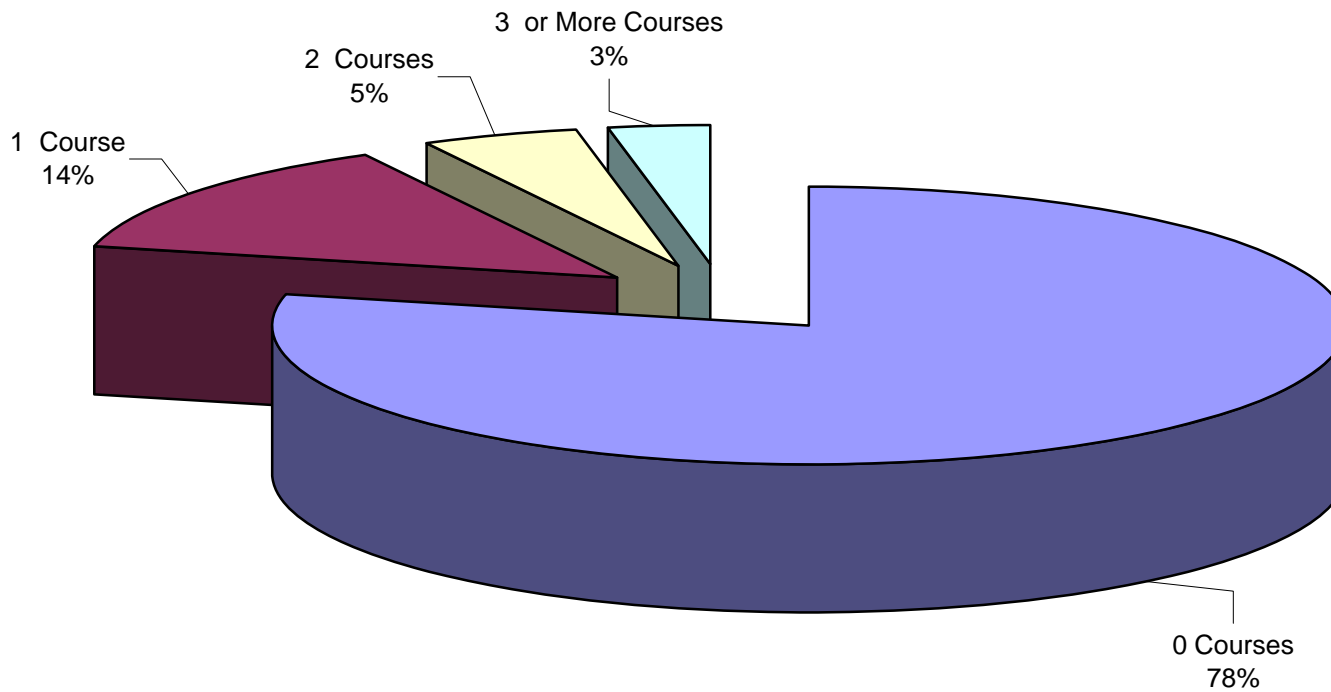
# Developmental Studies Enrollment Aggregate Spring 2008



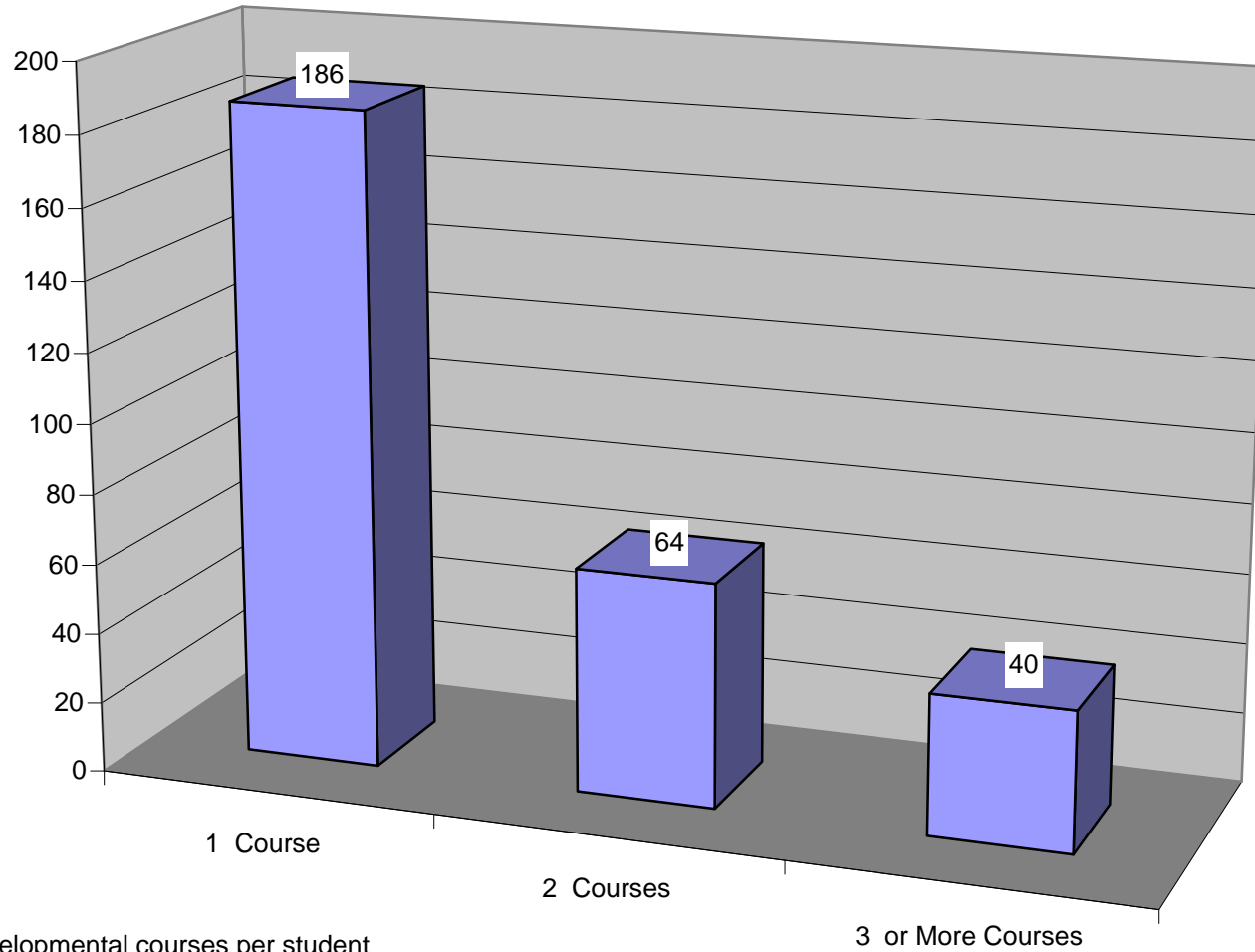
# Students Enrolled Exclusively in Developmental Studies Courses Spring 2008

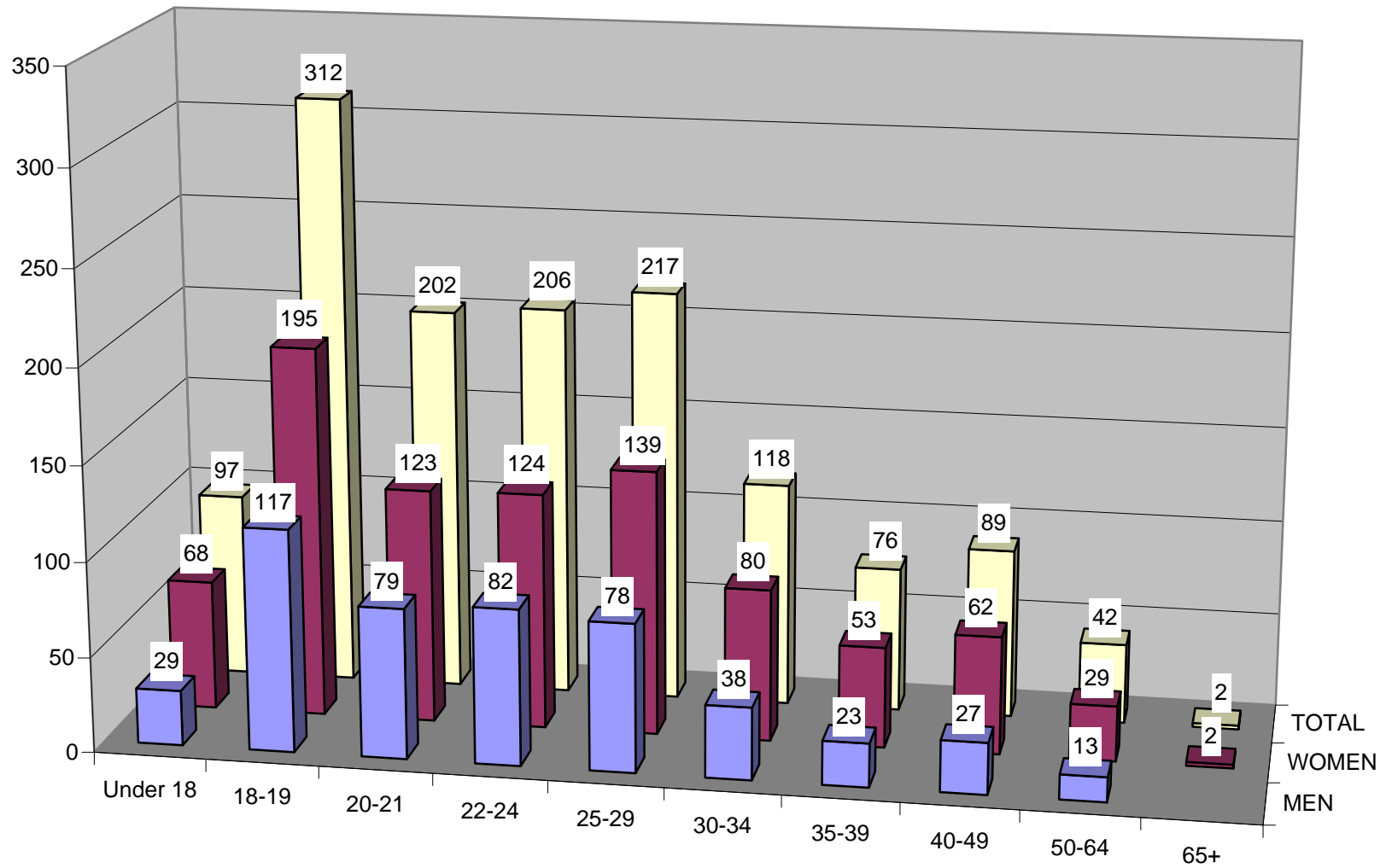

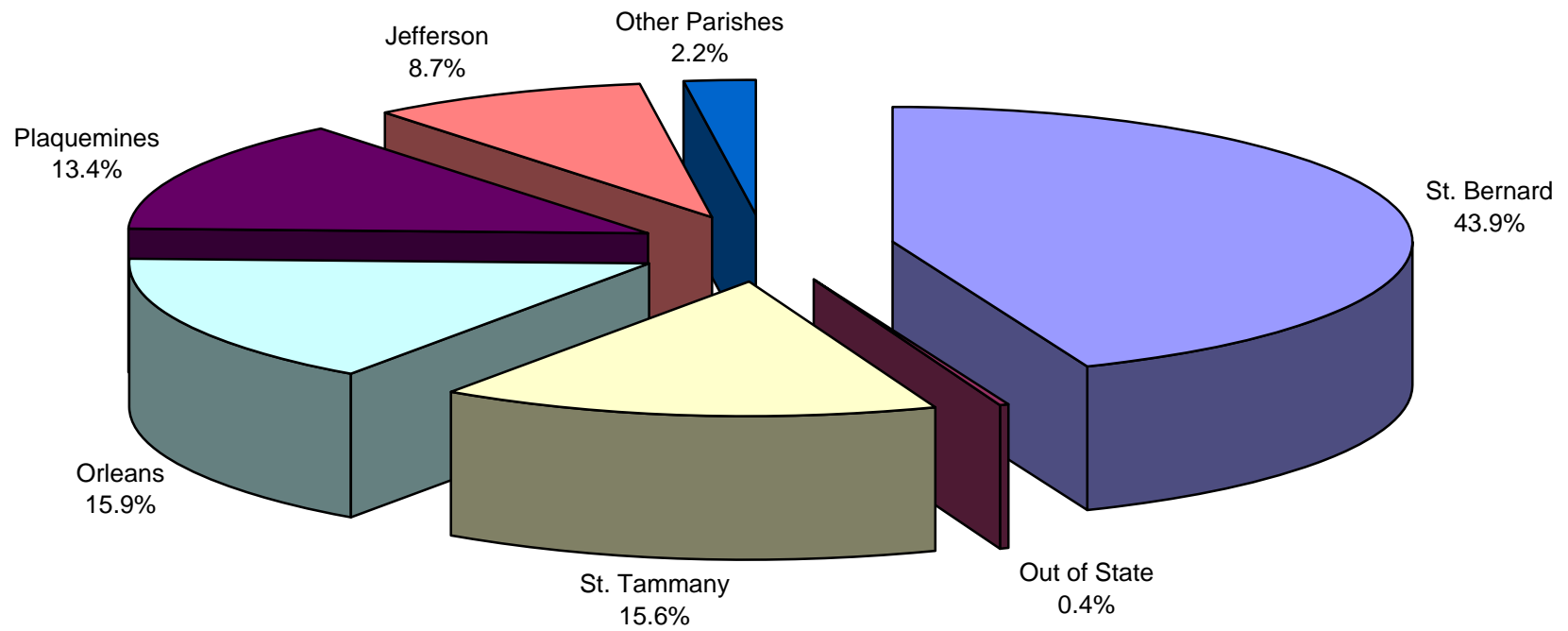

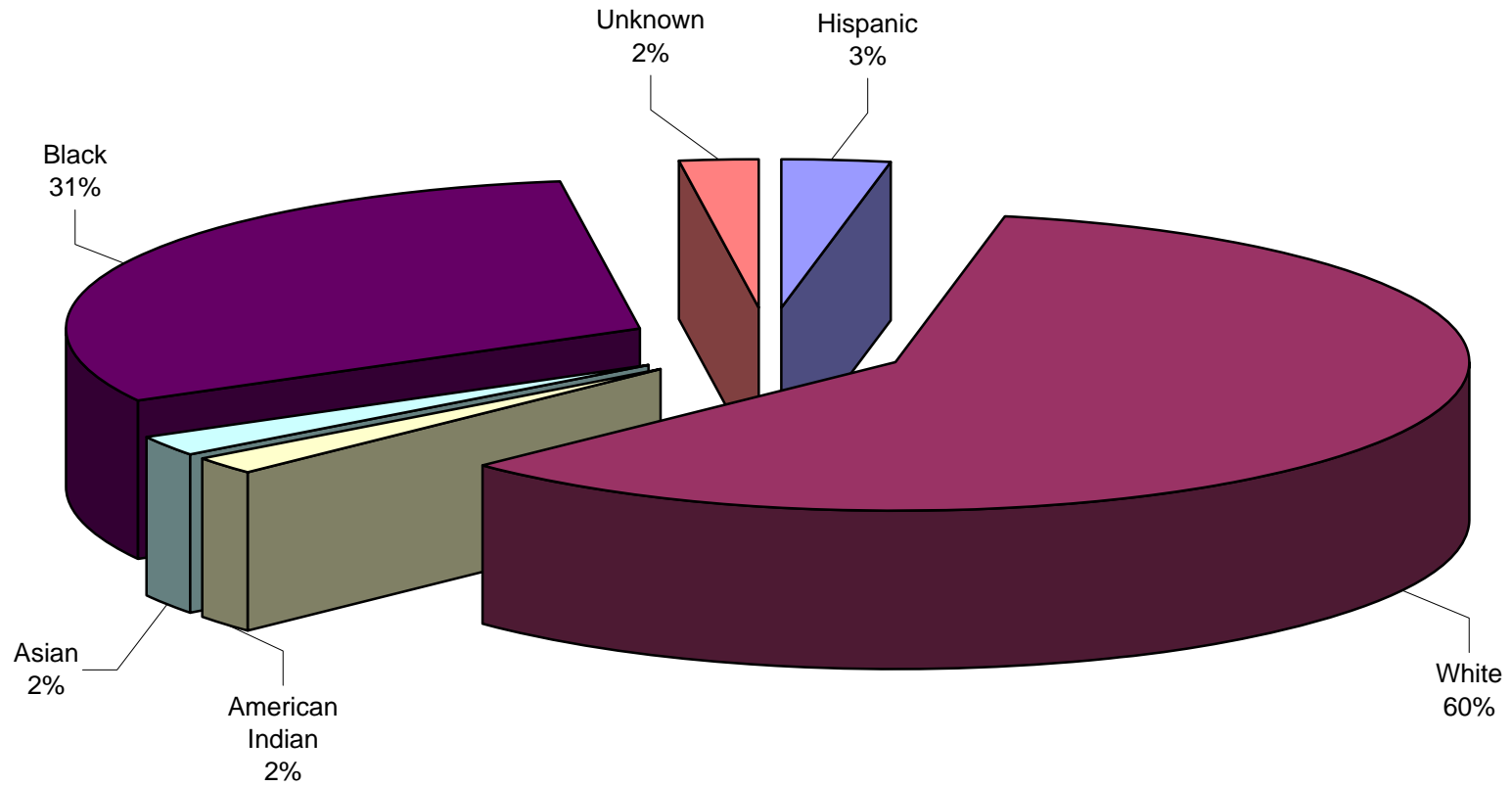
## Students by Age Distribution Spring 2008

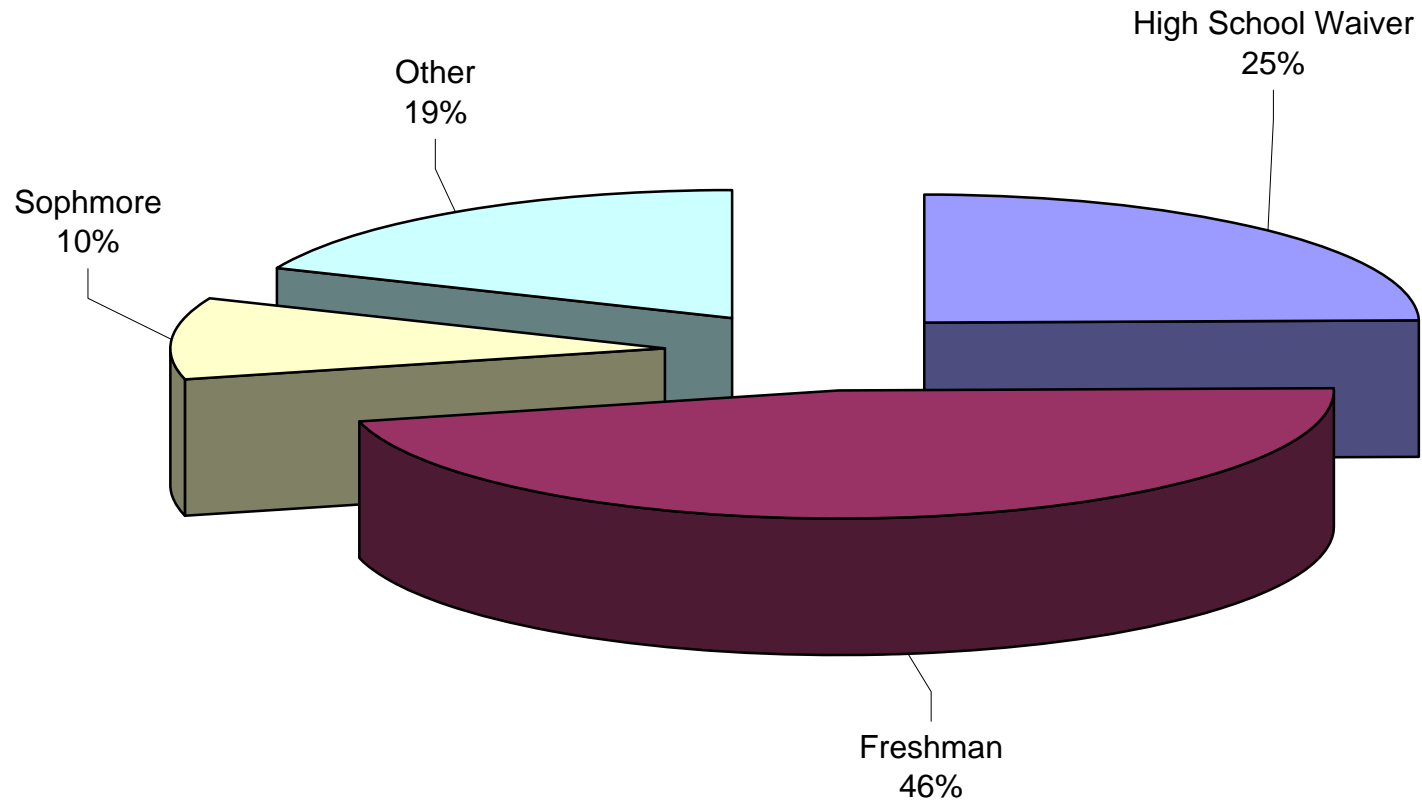


# Student Enrollment by Ethnicity Spring 2008



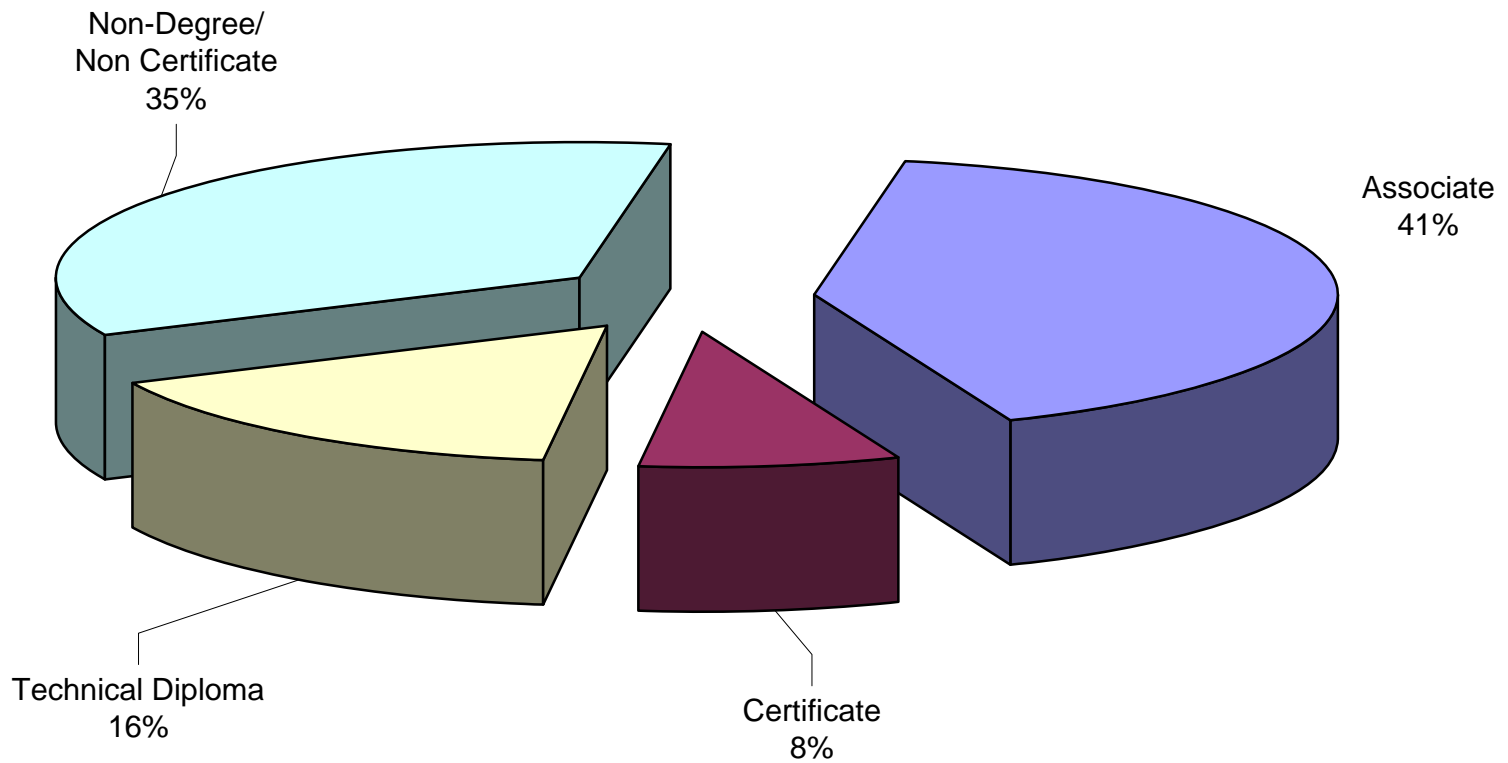


# Students by Year of Study Spring 2008



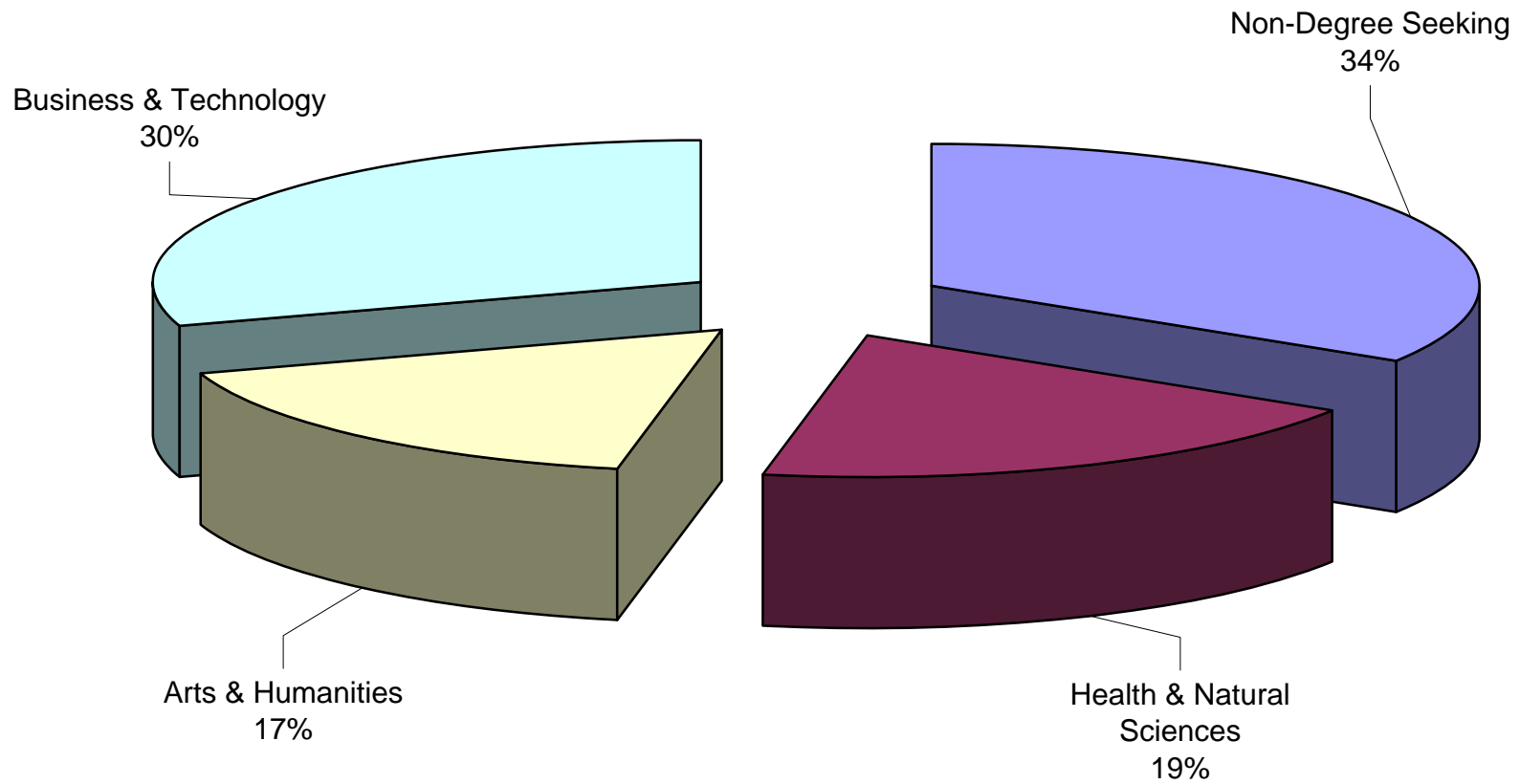

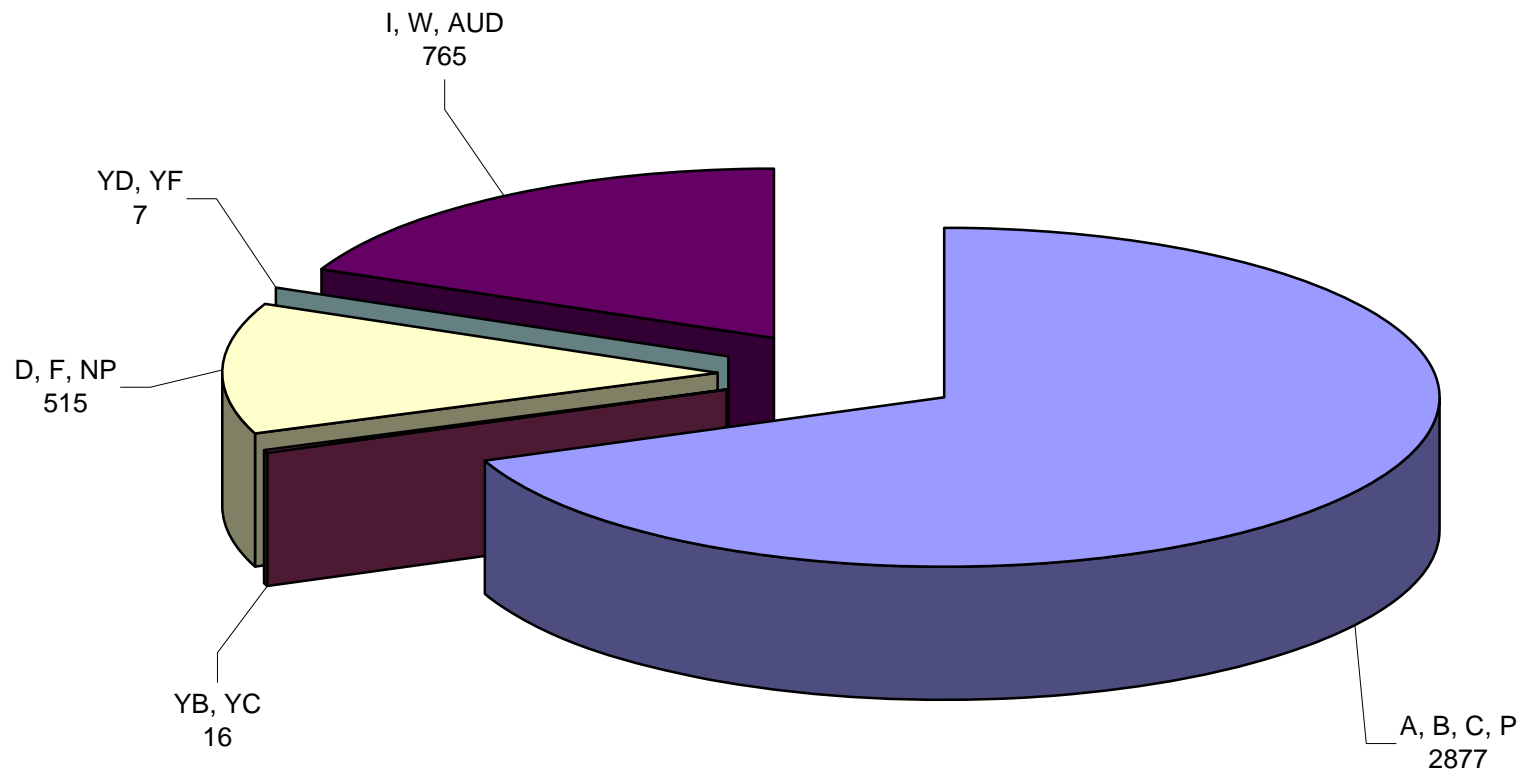

**Grade Distribution 2007 - 2008**

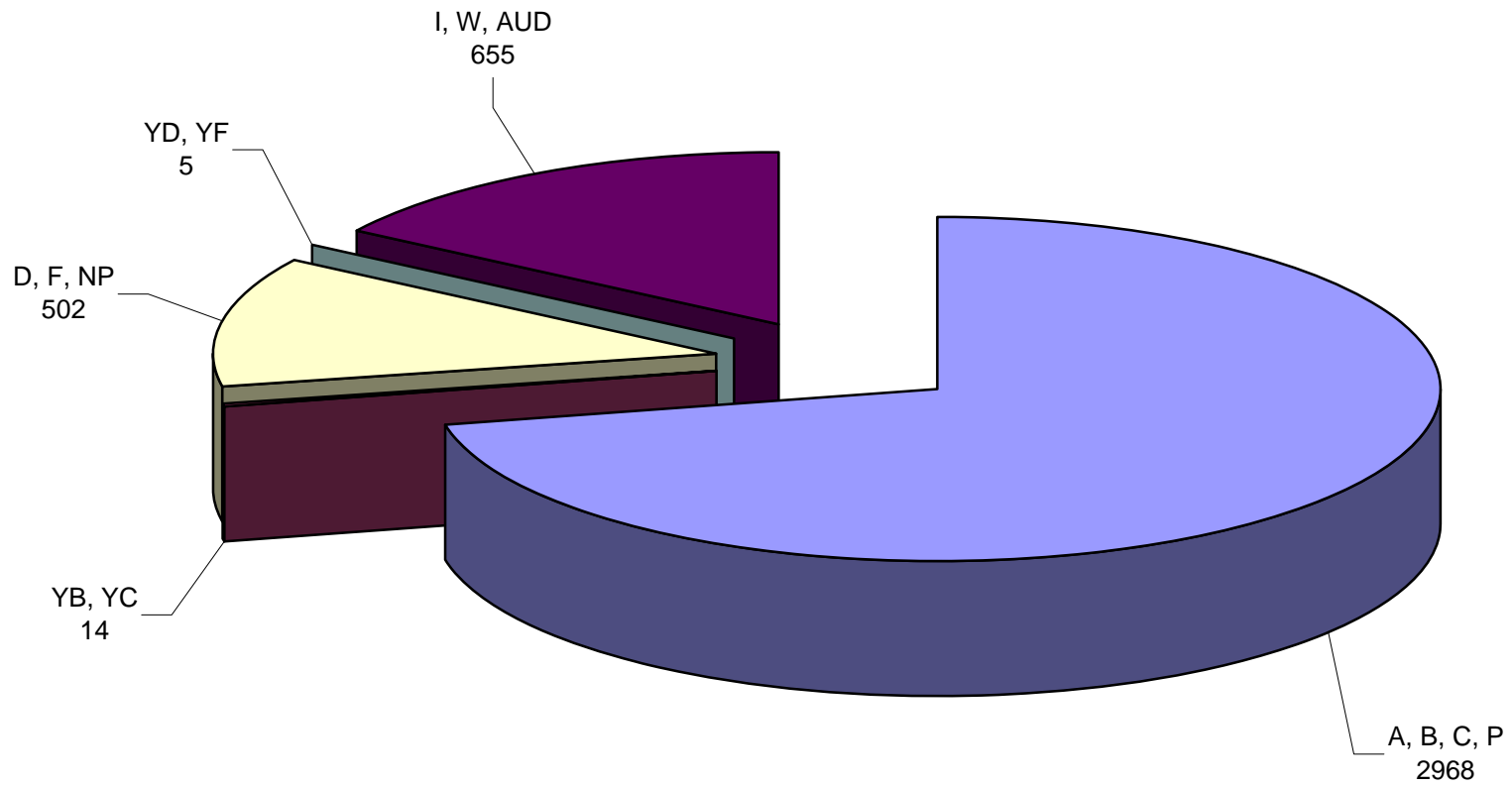
# Grade Distribution Fall 2007

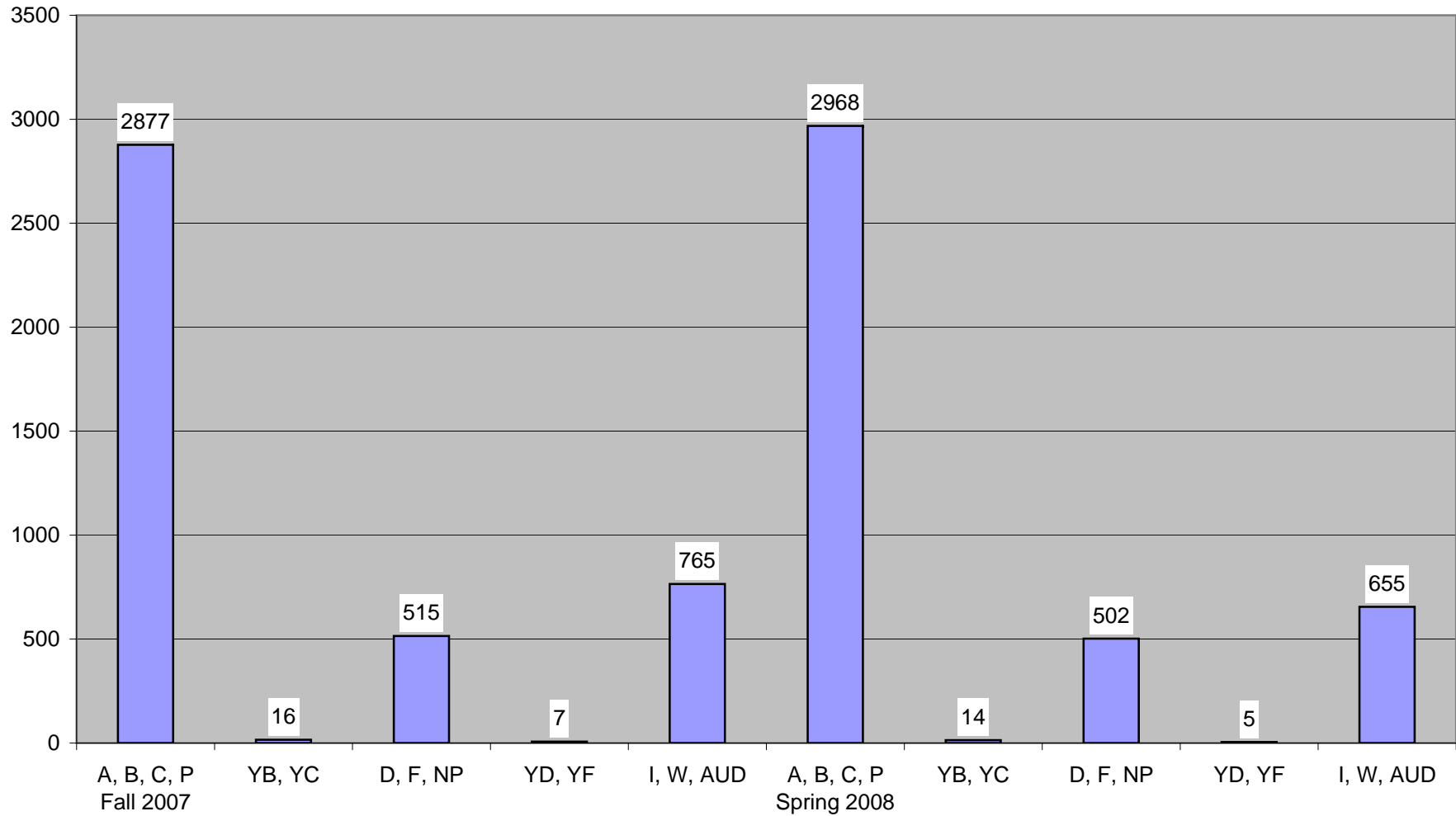


# Grade Distribution Spring 2008

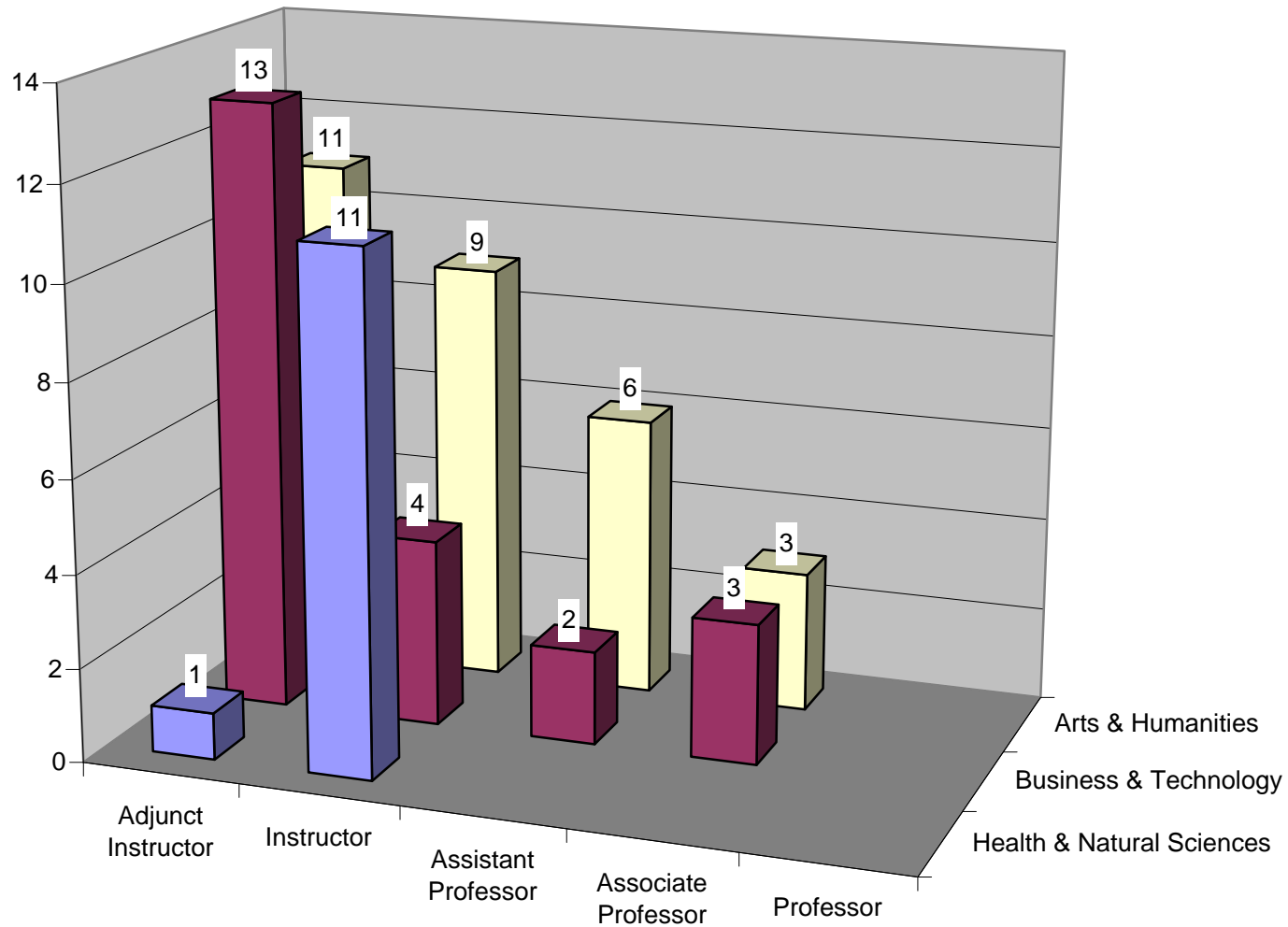
# Grade Distribution Fall 2007 - Spring 2008



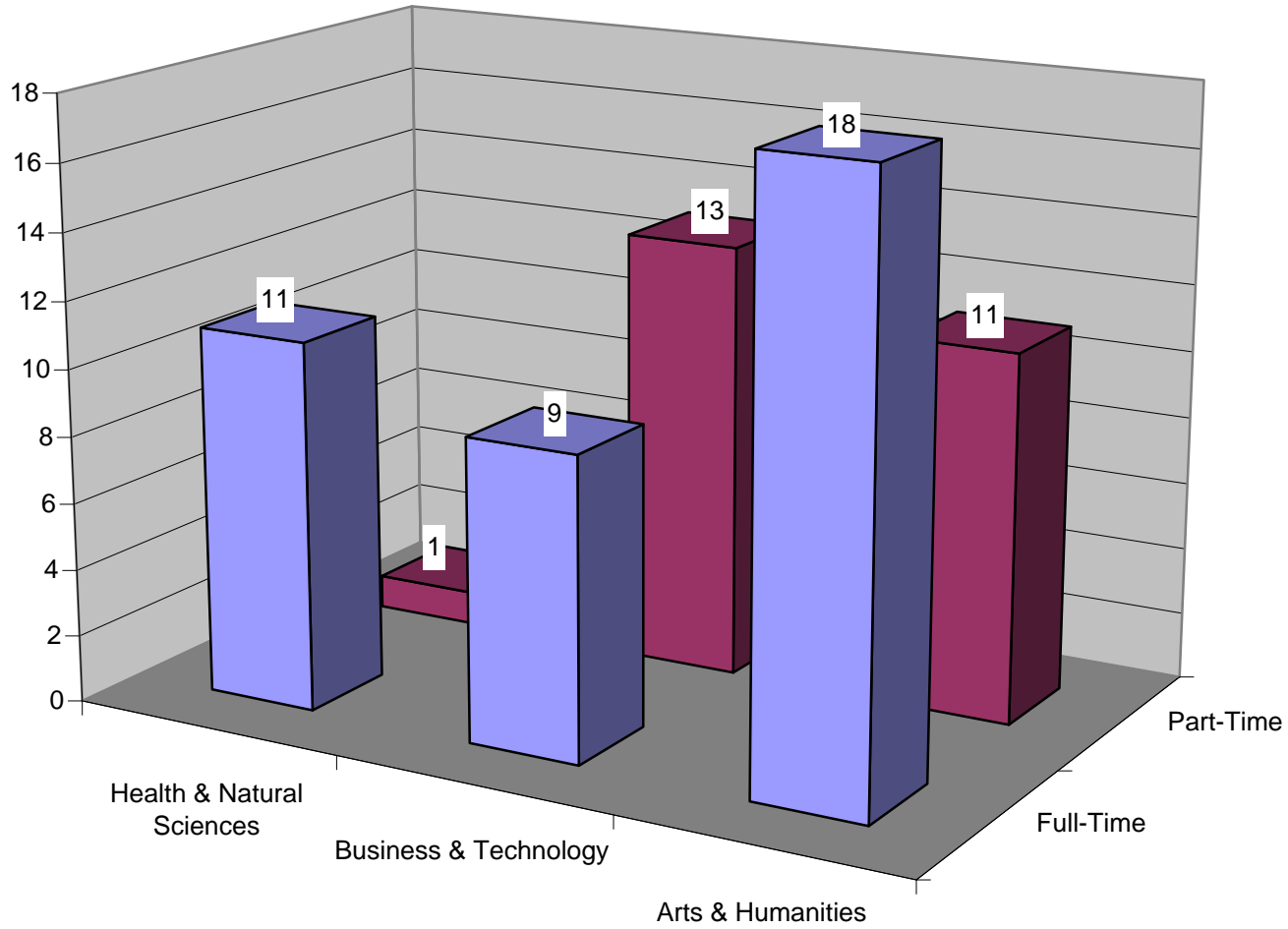

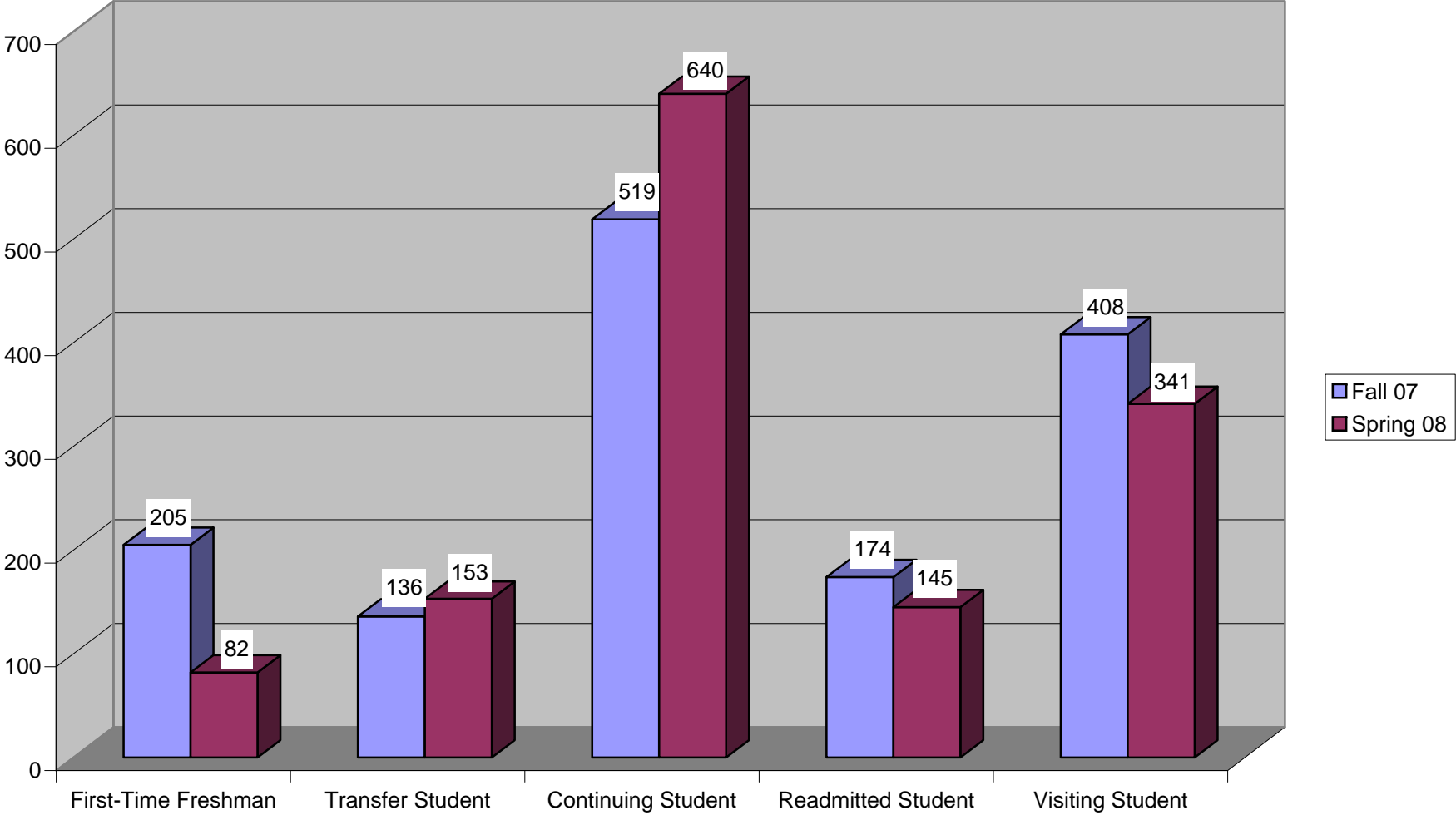

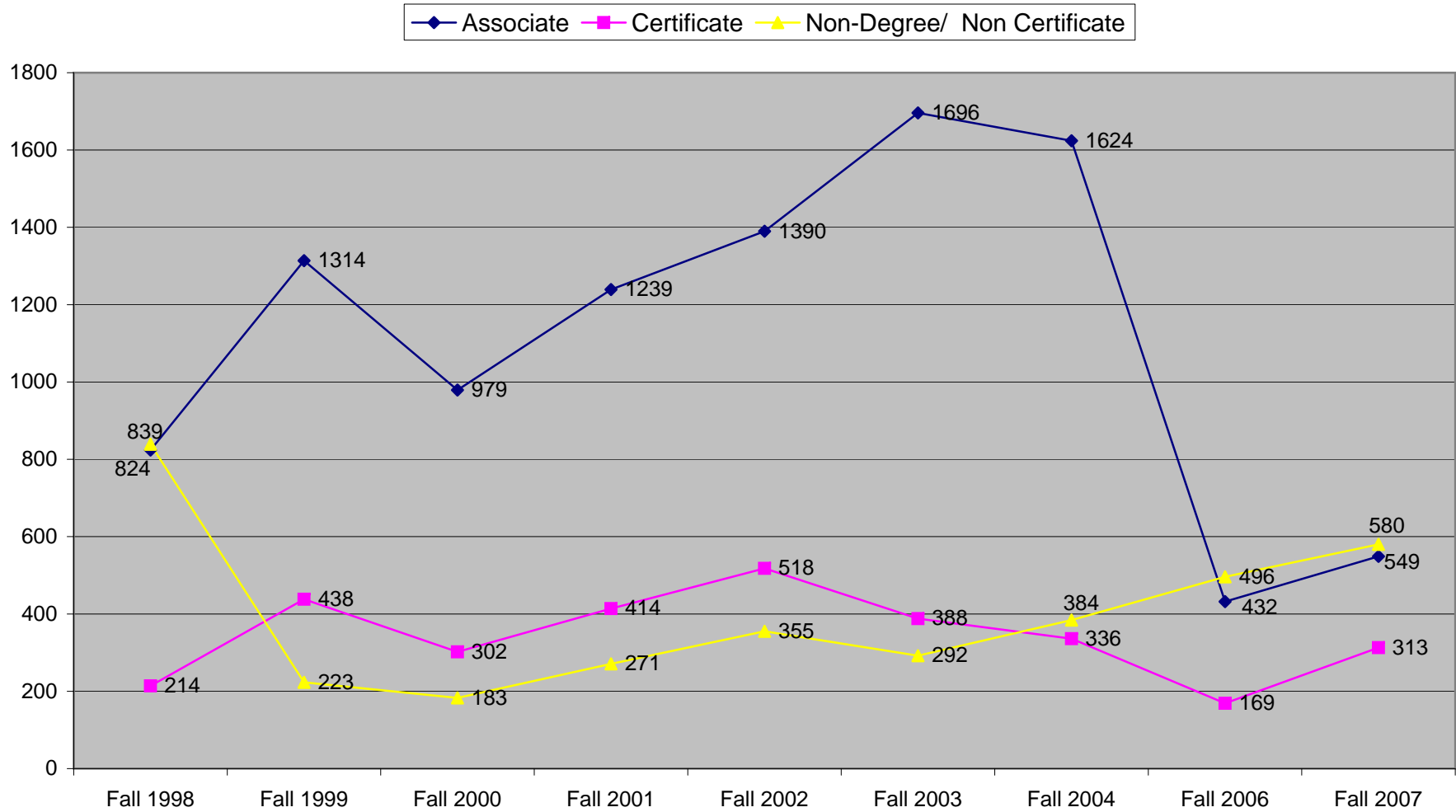

# Students by Admission Status Fall 2007 - Spring 2008



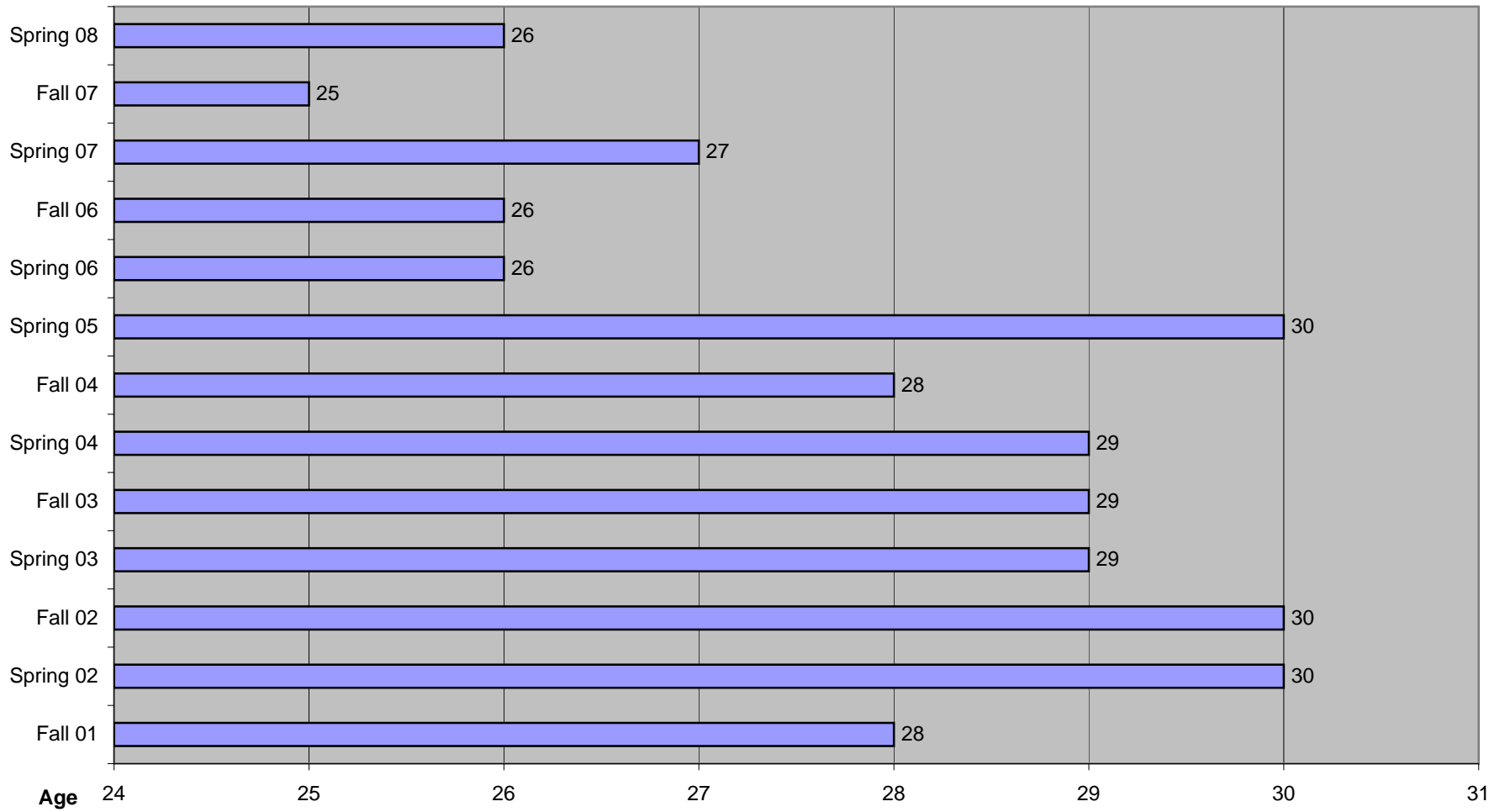


## Degrees Sought by Students Fall Semesters 1998 - 2007



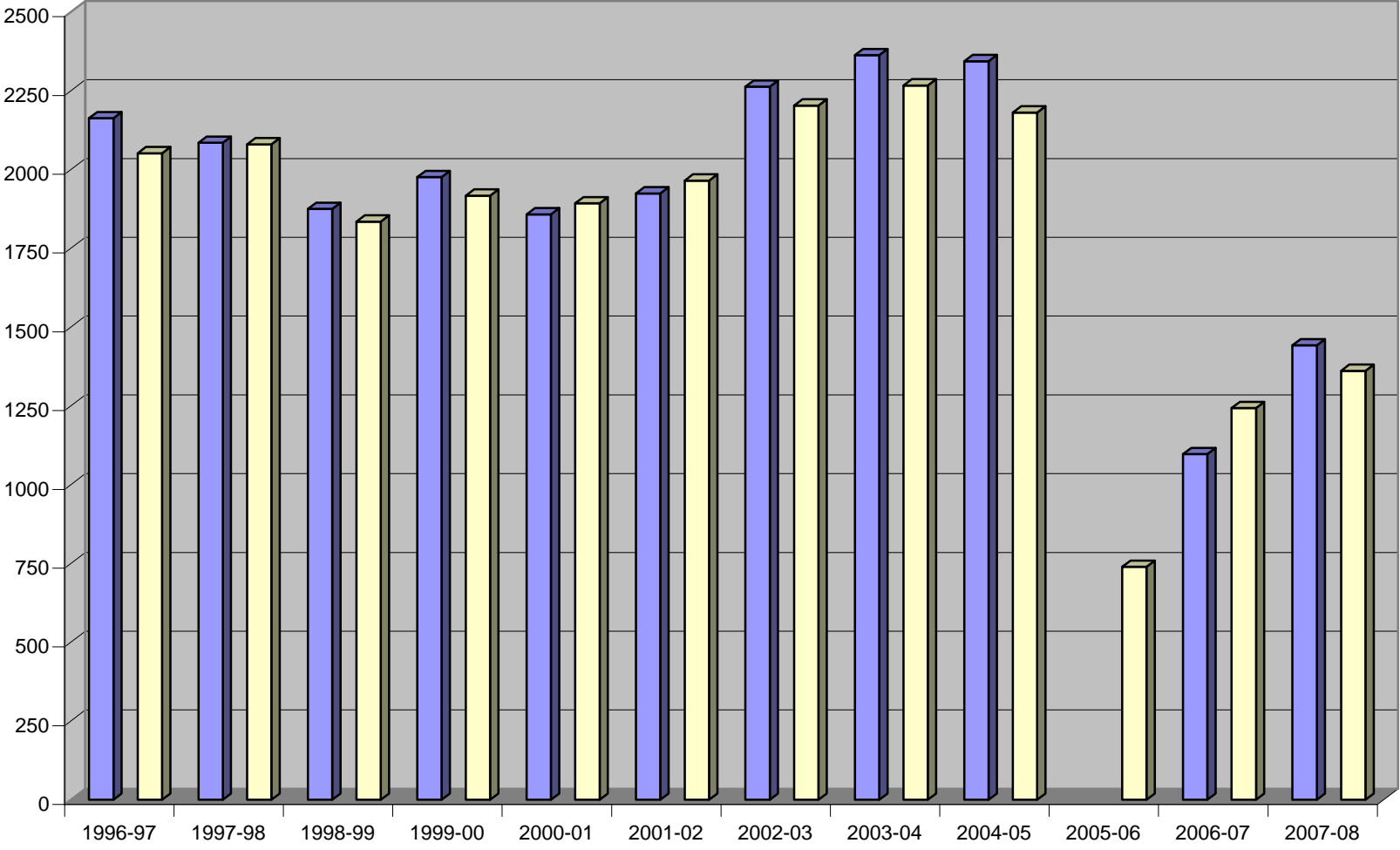

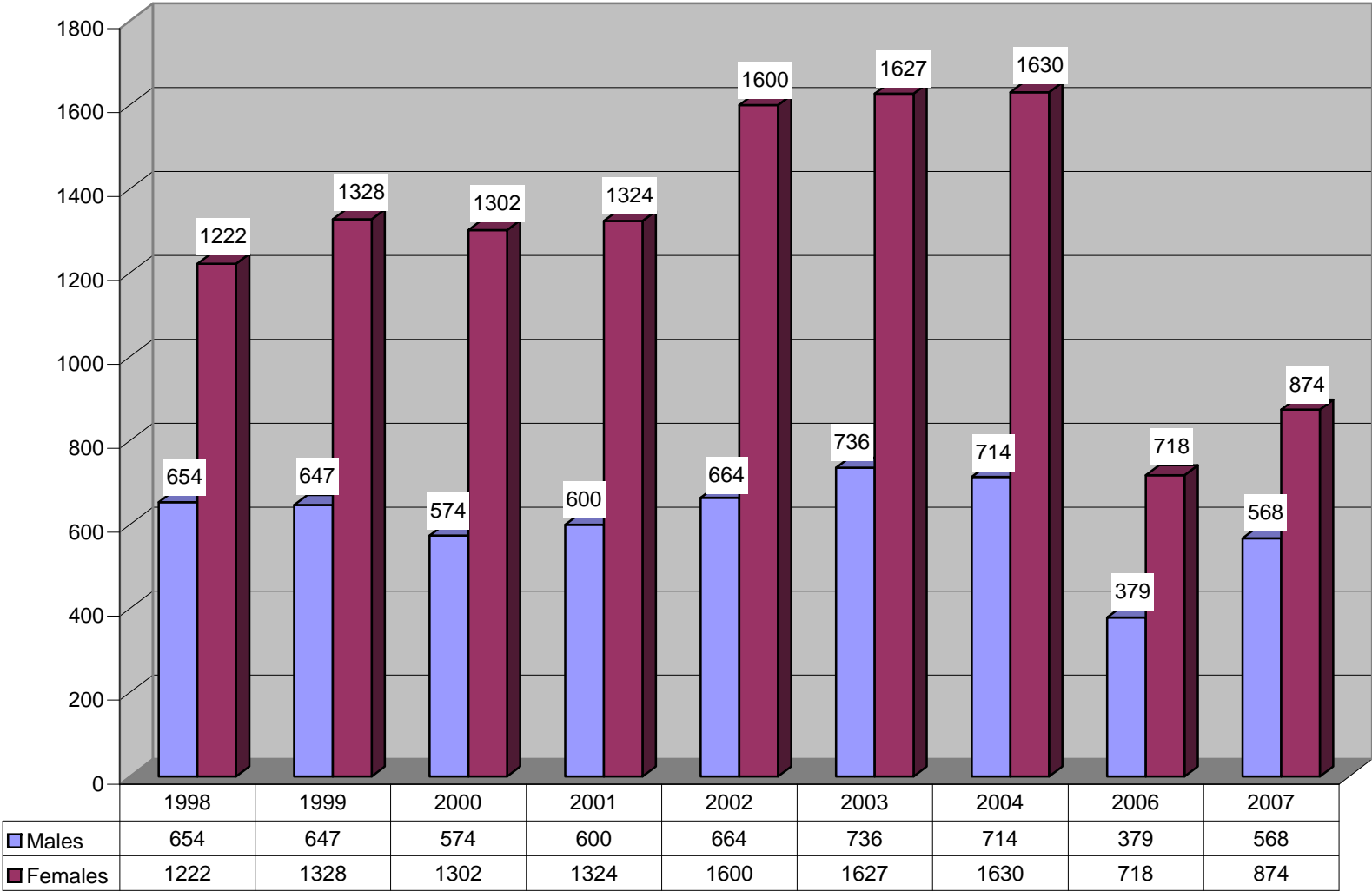
# Enrollment Growth by Semester Fall and Spring 1996-2008

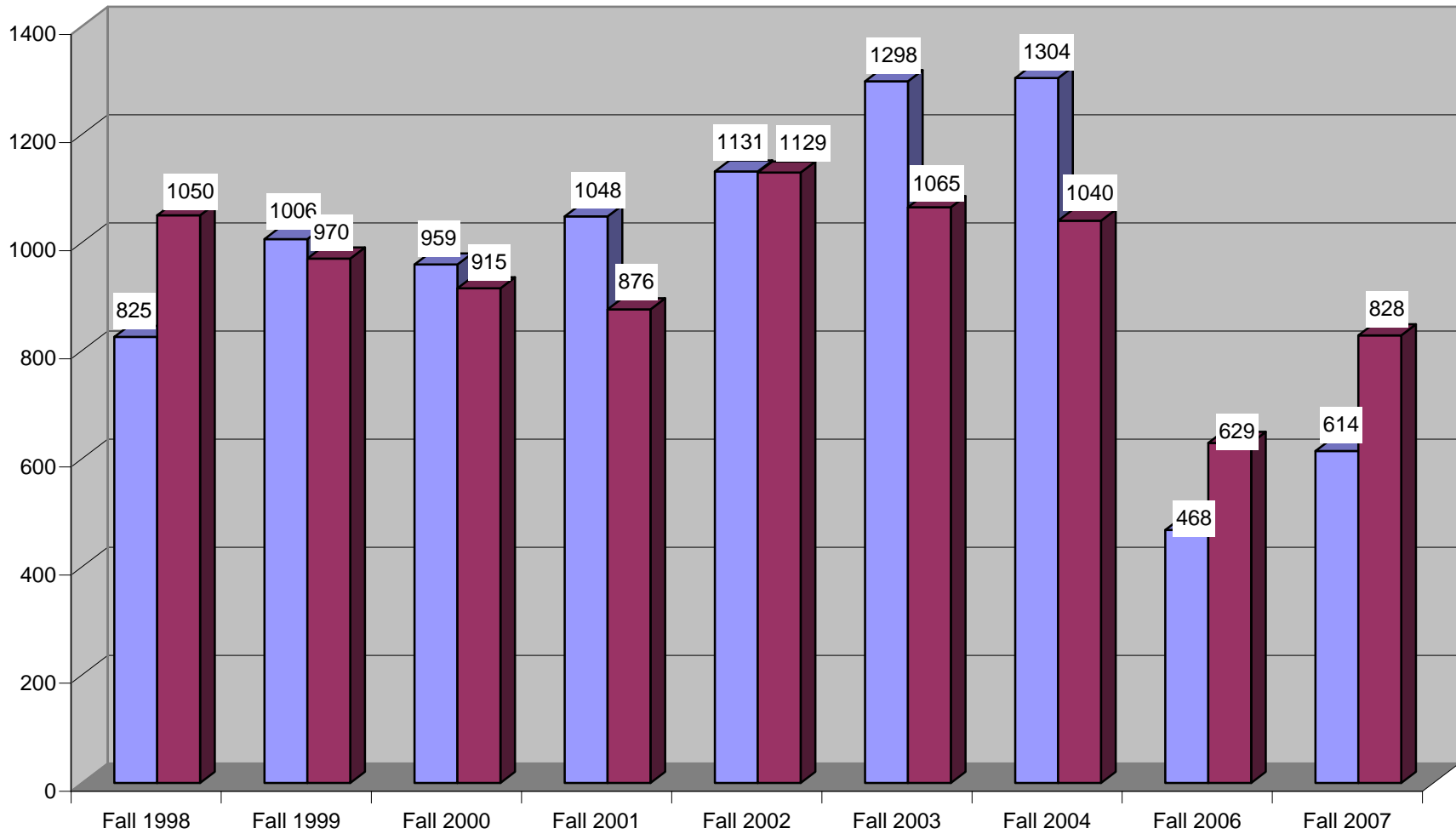

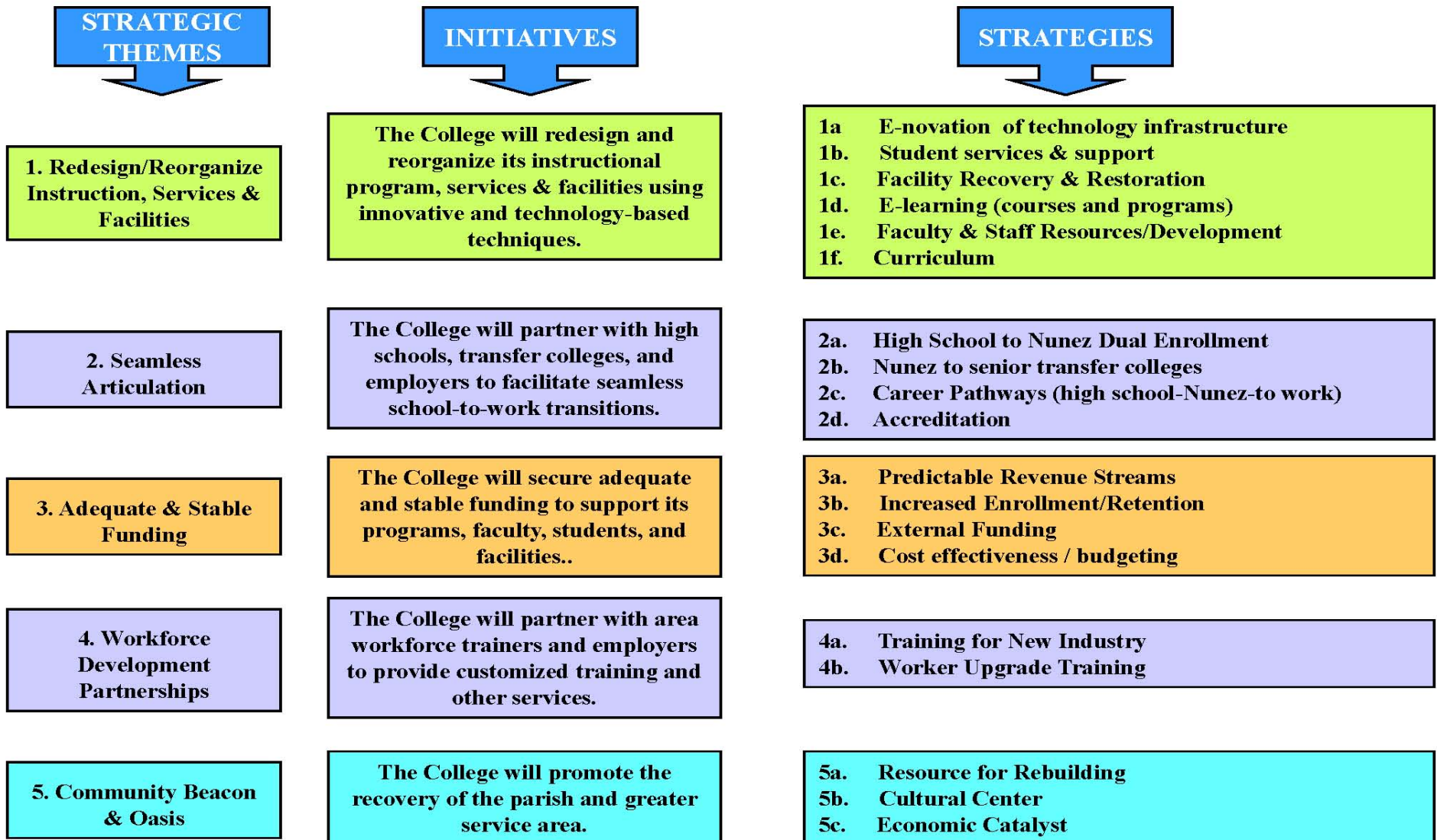

# Tech Fee Requests Results 2007 - 2008

As per House Bill No. 2339 (Regular Session 1997) and with the approval of the SGA Governing Board, the College will assess each student a \$5 per credit hour Technology Fee up to a maximum of \$60 per semester. This is a mandatory additional fee to be used for the sole purpose of improving technologies available to students regardless of major or status.

Due to Hurricane Katrina, the College does not have a current SGA Governing Board, but there are several students who are attempting to get the SGA up and running again. They are currently attempting to get an SGA Election set up for the Spring Semester, to provide us with SGA Officers for the coming Fall.

Since we do not have a current SGA Governing Board, no large scale purchasing with the Tech Fee have been made. Rather, only previously approved, recurring services, which the SGA had approved to continue regularly, prior to Hurricane Katrina, have been paid.

8 1/2" Letter Size Paper (So that Students can Print out Free Copies in the Library Lab and Library Copier.)

Copier Maintenance Contract (So that Students will have access to a Free Copier on Campus.)
