Academic Excellence Fee

The Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges, by R.S. 17:1871 (B) and 3351 (A) (5) and in accordance with Article VII, Section 2.1 (A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, has provided for the assessment of an academic excellence fee at each institution under its management and supervision effective for the Fall 2003 session and thereafter. The board established this fee in addition to other tuition and attendance fees. The purpose of this fee is to promote academic excellence by enhancing instructional programs; however, no proceeds shall be used to pay the salary of any university or university system administrator.

Bookstore Access Fee

The Follett Access program at Nunez ensures that all students will begin the semester with all of the resources they will need to be successful. Students will have immediate, reliable, and affordable access to any textbooks and instructor-required course supplies.

Building Use Fee

The building use fee, approved by the State Legislature (Act 426 (House Bill 671) in 2013, is established by the Louisiana Community and Technical College System Board of Supervisors to construct, repair, maintain, operate and improve facilities and physical infrastructure of the College.

Course/Laboratory Fee

Some courses may require an additional fee each term to cover the additional resources required to teach the course.

Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Fee

Effective Fall 2010, the Board of Supervisors for the Louisiana Community and Technical College System (LCTCS) approved a fee to support the implementation and continued operation of the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system.

Excess Credit Hour

Effective Fall 2016, the Board of Supervisors for the Louisiana Community and Technical College System approved an Excess Credit Hour Fee assessed on all students registered with 16 or more campus-based credit hours. The fee is \$150.96 per credit hour for the 16th credit hour and each additional credit hour each term.

Online Registration Fee

Registration fee charged per semester if enrolled in at least one online course.

Operational fee

Effective Fall 2004, State of Louisiana Legislators (House Bill 993) and the LCTCS approved an operational fee to be assessed at all state colleges and universities, to cover operational expenses no longer covered by the state.

Parking, Safety and Security Fee

Effective with the Summer 2020 semester, as authorized by the LCTCS Policy #5.011, this fee replaces the parking fee and will not require a student decal. The fee includes the administration, operation, construction, repair, maintenance, security and operation of traffic, parking and parking facilities and other operational expenses.

Student Governmental Association (SGA) fee

The proceeds from this fee go directly to the Student Government Association (SGA), which oversees the disbursement of the funds to various student activities. In addition, funds are provided to various academic departments for cultural enrichment, and to clubs and organizations for activities that benefit the entire student body.

Student Activity fee

Effective Summer 2017, LCTCS Board authorize Nunez's SGA to charge a fee to fund intercollegiate/intramural athletic activities and other extracurricular events.

Student Services fee

Effective Fall 2011, the Board of Supervisors for the Louisiana Community and Technical College System (LCTCS) approved a student services fee at all LCTCS colleges. This fee provides student services including applications, registration, identification cards, retention services, and graduation ceremonies.

Technology fee

This self-assessed student fee was approved by the State Legislature and ratified by the Student Government Associations in 1997. The proceeds are for the purposes of "implementing, replacing, improving, and expanding technologies to benefit student life and learning" (from Legislative Act 1450, 1997).

Non-Residential Fee – Currently suspended.

Purpose: Act 170 of the 1998 1st Extraordinary session which created the LCTC System. Non-resident Tuition helps to fund the institution to fulfill the mission of the college to provide Workforce Training in Louisiana. LRS 17:2136
